

### ALUMINUM WARE INCREASING IN GENERAL USAGE

Aluminum cooking utensils, particularly the newest improved ones, are becoming increasingly popular with the modern housewife, who insists on quality as well as brightness in kitchen utensils. Tests have proven that aluminum is absolutely safe if correctly used and washed.

It is claimed that for cooking purposes aluminum has an added advantage over tin or enameled ironware, in that it possesses a higher heat conductivity and heat capacity than either. By a series of careful tests, in which various types of vessels were used, it was demonstrated that aluminum is, without doubt, a safe metal in which to prepare foods for daily consumption.

Alkaline liquids or substances which are boiled or cooked in aluminum vessels produce a brown discoloration on the case work, which contains copper. This stain of aluminum in use with certain waters has long been observed, but the actual reason for this effect has only recently been explained, according to H. C. Melson of the Aluminum Cooking Utensil Co. Hard water is usually slightly alkaline in reaction. It is for this reason that aluminum used for cooking utensils has been found to discolor much more rapidly in certain sections of the country than in others.

As the result of scientific inquiry it is now possible for housewives and others responsible for the care of aluminum cooking utensils to correct the discoloration. A quarter of a teaspoonful of vinegar added to the water used for cooking operations is so small an amount that it will not affect the flavor of the foods being cooked. It is only necessary to add the small amount of vinegar when the water used is of a hard or alkaline nature.

Study was made to determine just which fruits and vegetables contain the greatest amounts of acid juices that have a slight corrosive effect on all forms of metal utensils. A number of different vegetables were cooked in aluminum vessels using standard methods of cooking. After the dishes were finished the food was carefully subjected to analysis to determine how much contamination from aluminum compounds or salts had been produced in the food. If salt was added before cooking the extent of discoloration was much less than in cases where salt had been added later.

Housewives should be warned that the use of oxalic acid, to prevent stain of cooking utensils, is dangerous and that the poison acid has no place in any kitchen.
