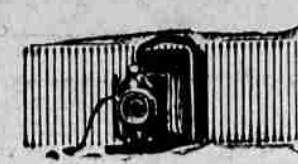


# CAMERAGRAMS



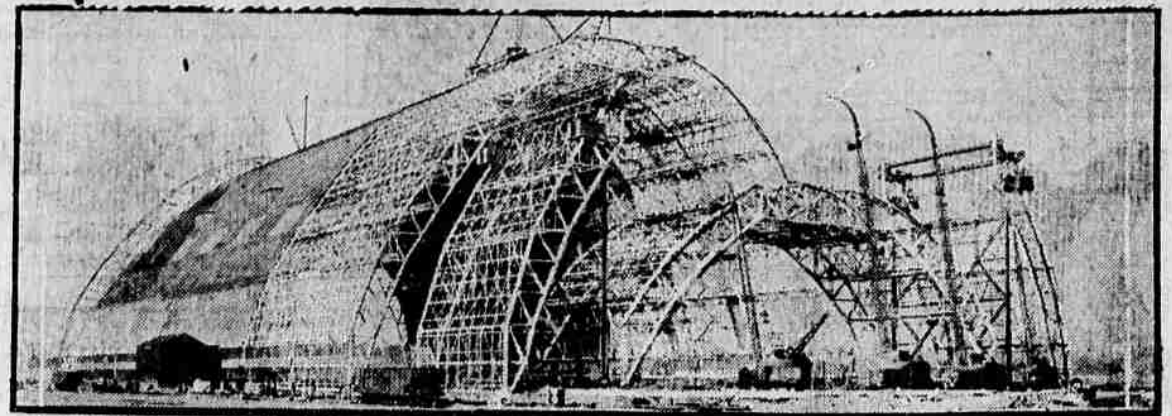

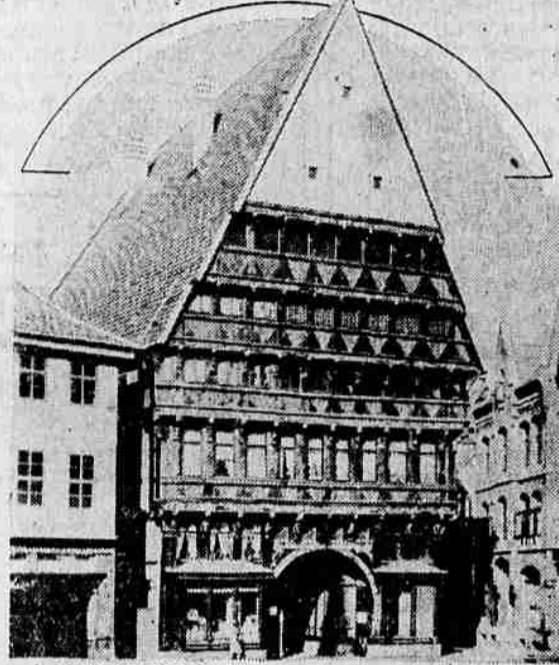

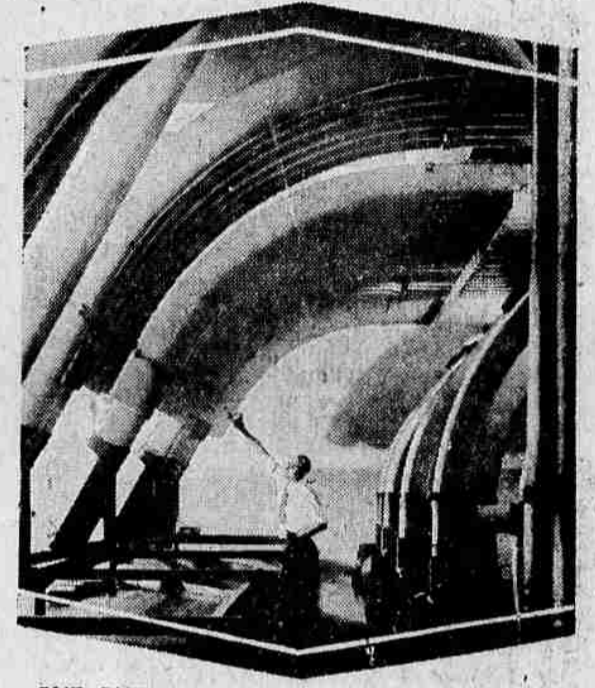
**NEWCOMER**, and a popular one, to the screen is lovely Joan Bennett. She's also a charming young lady in bathing costume, isn't she?

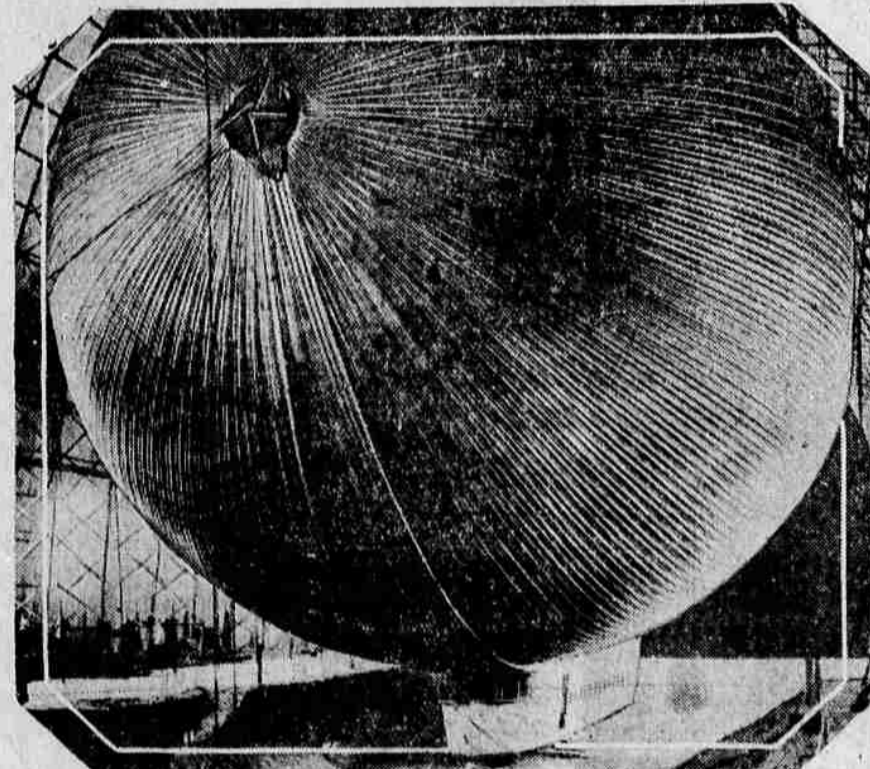
**A MASTERPIECE OF GOTHIC ARCHITECTURE** is this 400-year-old Butcher's Guild House in Hildesheim, Germany. Its five stories project above one another with artistically decorated portions. Critics consider it the outstanding example of timber construction remaining of the late Gothic period.

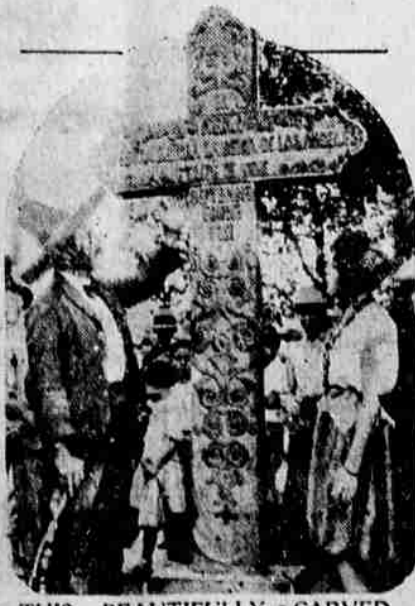

**A STEAM-DRIVEN ALL-METAL DIRIGIBLE** is next on the air program. This shows the nose of the huge ship nearing completion at its Glendale, Calif., hangar. The blower which creates a partial vacuum (the circular section exposed) makes an air pressure which drives the ship forward.



**LINCOLN'S TOMB** at Springfield, Ill., is portrayed in an unusually striking manner by this photograph taken through the foliage of surrounding trees. Extensive repairs are being made to this memorial sarcophagus.



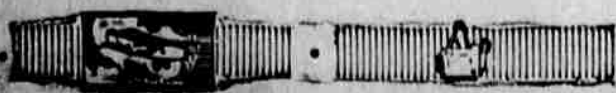
