

EGGS HOLD FIRM BUTTER DECLINES

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 15.—(AP)—Leaving eggs, pecked high and dry on values far above which has prevailed for a long time, butter prices declined at the Portland Produce Exchange today. All the grades except firsts went down 1 cent. Butterfat quotations at the same time underwent a similar reduction. If anything, eggs were firmer today than they were at the time of Monday's advance, although no additional increase has been announced. Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland Market News Service of the United States Bureau of Agriculture says: "Potatoes are firm and trading very active at all northwestern shipping points. The Portland market is holding about steady, with no change in prices, however."

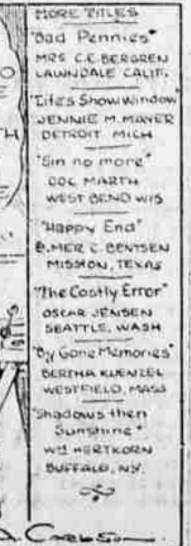

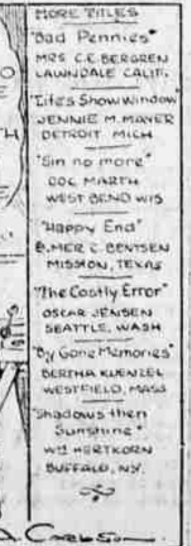
