FLOUR PRICE CUT BY SPERRY MILLS

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 18.—(AP) In keeping with the tumbling wheat market, the Sperry Flour company has reduced the price of all flour 26 cents.

With eggs advancing one cent at San Francisco and declining one cent at New York, Portland prices were firm, but unchanged.

The turkey supply is moderate, but appears more than sufficient to supply the local trade.

Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland News-Service of the United States Bureau of Economics says:

"Trading was fairly active on the wholesale fruit and vegetable market this morning. Potato prices are unchanged.

"Interest in pears has declined, and the few present offerings of fine quality Boses, D'Anjous and Comice are meeting with very slow demand."

Wants Courthouse Now.

To the Editor:

In your recent editorial in regard to the courthouse, you state there is plenty of time as the site is bound to be linked up with the Washington school site.

We fail to grasp the idea, as the courthouse is a county affair and should not be linked up with any civic center idea or school building program.

It seems to me that considering the fact that the courthouse is to be built by and for the people of the whole county, without any cost to the residents of Medford, other than a site, that the people of Medford and the newspapers, real estate promoters, etc., should be fair-minded enough to let the county officials locate it where they please, without being held up to wait for a site as inadequate as the Washington school site would be.

The city now owns a large portion of a site and the rest can be bought right that is much nearer the highway, more room, can be made more beautiful and would be much more satisfactory to the non-residents of Medford than the Washington school site would be.

It will take from two to three years to complete plans and build a courthouse such as Jackson county can build, so let's choose from the available sites and build it, and not hold up a county building on account of some old school building.

Do not lose sight of the fact that a courthouse as built by all the taxpayers of the county should be located where the representatives want it and not where Medford's ward board and a few prominent property owners might want it located.
