Oregon Cow Crashes World Record



The Lion's Lila.

Breaking the world champion-ship of another Oregon Jersey cow, The Lion's Lila, owned by Harry D. Hiff of Independence, Oregon, has completed the highest 305-day butterfat production record in the history of the Jersey breed.

Started on test at the age of 3 years and 11 months, she yielded 226.55 lbs. of butterfat and 13,844 lbs. of milk, the equivalent of 115 1/2 lbs. of butter and 6439 quarts of milk in 305 days.

On account of the phenomenal yield of The Lion's Lila Mr. Hiff continued her test and at the end of 365 days she had produced 1,086.20 lbs. of butterfat and 16,664 lbs. of milk, the equivalent of 1375 lbs of butter and 7722 quarts of milk.

Ten different supervisors, six from the Oregon State Agricultural College, two from Washington and two from Idaho, checked Lila's yield during the test. She was milked by machine throughout the year. Mr. Hiff is unfortunately, partially disabled by rheumatism.

Mr. Hiff now has the unique distinction of being the only Jersey breeder in the world to own four living Jersey cows that have produced 1000 lbs. of butterfat, or 1250 lbs. of butter, in a year.

GROCERY STORE HAS ATTRACTION FOR BIG POLICE DOG VISITOR
