

MAJOR PROCLAIMS OBSERVANCE HERE OF LIGHT JUBILEE

Mayor A. W. Pipes, in a proclamation, calls upon the city to display flags from public buildings, business houses and homes tomorrow, in honor of "Light's Golden Jubilee" and the discovery of the incandescent lamp by Thomas A. Edison.

The proclamation is as follows: Fifty years ago on October 21st, when light first burst forth from Thomas A. Edison's incandescent lamp, the world did not realize that there was then given to the human race one of the greatest benefactions of all time. From the invention of this tiny illuminating spark humanity has emerged into a new world. Great hydro-electric plants have sprung into being, which have multiplied and given a new impetus to the wheels of industry throughout the world. Through this medium more convenient, more comfortable and more rapid transportation has resulted and satisfied man's desire. American homes are warmed and transformed into palaces of comfort and convenience.

Thus it is befitting that all our people do honor to this great man, yet living, upon this the fiftieth anniversary of the invention which has touched and brightened every life of the present civilization.

In conformity with this purpose, October 21st has been designated as "Light's Golden Jubilee" and business and civic organizations throughout America are called upon to observe this day with appropriate programs and special decorations.

Now, therefore, I, A. W. Pipes, Mayor of the City of Medford, do hereby designate Monday, October 21st, 1929, as the time for official observance of "Light's Golden Jubilee" in Medford, and I earnestly request that the day be observed by our citizens; that flags be displayed from public buildings, business houses and residences, and that civic and school bodies cooperate in paying proper tribute to Thomas A. Edison, benefactor of mankind.

to forward passes. Forward-lateral passes, side-laterals and quick tips to the back bewildered the invaders. Eleven as Stanford piled up six touchdowns in sixty minutes of spectacular play.

Just as their brothers from the University of Oregon did two weeks ago, the Staters caught the Cards napping when the game got under way. Two minutes after the Oregonians had kicked off they scored a touchdown. Stanford had failed to gain materially in two plays and punted. Burke, Oregon State quarterback, slipped back and passed 29 yards to McCallip, left end, who ran 55 yards down a clear field to cross the last line. Hughes converted the try for point.

The Cardinals came out of their lethargic state with a bang. A touchdown followed a mighty thrust from Stanford's 29-yard line. Prentup, left half, started the parade with a 23-yard smash through left tackle. Continued assaults at the line and short pass put the ball on the one-yard mark from where Fleischacker bumped through center. The extra point was made on a fake kick, Smalling passing to Caglieri.

Stanford pulled its second touchdown from the air after the next kickoff. Caglieri popped up to intercept Burke's pass on Oregon State's 45-yard line. Smalling shot a 25-yard pass over center to Muller who loped the remaining ten yards to score. A short pass, Smalling to Prentup, accounted for the extra point.

Under full steam, the Cards punched over two more touchdowns in the second period. An Oregon State fumble, with Artman reasoning on the visitor's 37-yard line, opened the way. Line smashes and a 17-yard pass, Prentup to Caglieri, put the ball over. Smalling scored. Another intercepted pass led to the fourth touchdown. Prentup grabbed Metten's heave on Stanford's 25-yard line. After reaching a point a few yards over the mid-field mark, Smalling threw ten yards to Muller and the Stanford captain flipped a lateral pass to Caglieri who raced 33 yards to make the count 26-7 at half time.

The third quarter was barely under way when the big red team reached scoring territory again. For the third time an intercepted pass started the scoring spurge. Crary, substituting at quarterback for Fleischacker, picked off Burke's pass to give Stanford the ball on its opponent's 42-yard line.

A forward-lateral pass, started by Smalling, was relayed to Bush, right end, and finally landed in the hands of Winnek, right half, and the latter ran the remaining 22 yards to score. Moffat, left half, place kicked the try for point.

Two plays after the last period opened, Stanford scored again after a long drive down the field in the preceding quarter. Moffat went over and Winnek added to the extra point with a place kick.
