

FILIPINO FRUIT WORKERS FEEL WRATH OF MOB

Exeter, Cal., Carnival Is Scene of Race Riot When Oriental Stabs White Truck Driver — Officers Quiet Disturbance.

ExETER, Cal., Oct. 25.—(AP)—Peace returned to Exeter early today after the dispersal of several mobs of white laborers, who banded together during a race riot late last night and drove about 200 Filipino fruit workers from various camps near the town. Authorities said they expected no more trouble.

mediate cause of the riot, although authorities said ill feeling had existed between the whites and the Orientals for some time. Borerman was so badly wounded that he was expected to die. Authorities said he had been attacked with a bolo, a long knife, much used in the Philippines.

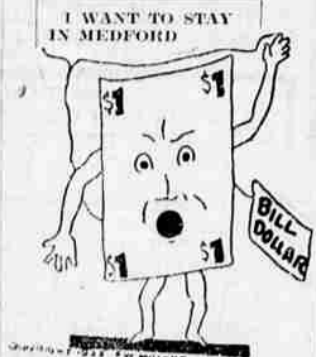
Both whites and Filipinos were attending a carnival when the trouble started. After the stabbing about 200 whites undertook to drive the Filipinos from the scene and the rioting began. The Filipinos fled. The white men then went to the ranch of E. J. Firebaugh, on the outskirts of town and drove about 50 Filipinos away, pelting them with stones and branding clubs and pitchforks.
