

GLENN OAK HOME OPEN TODAY FOR PUBLIC TO SEE

The sixth attractive residence to be built by the Southern Oregon Construction company in the Glenn Oak district during the past year will be open for public inspection today, Sunday.

A year ago Glenn Oak was a little more than a prospective location for homes surrounded by sturdy oaks, and all in all, a rather lonely part of the city.

Brown stained shades with just the right amount of cream trim create an unusual exterior effect. The entrance is brick, and an alcove porch adds to the attractiveness of the place.

Spanish type ivory plaster has been used throughout the downstairs on walls and barrel ceiling. Mahogany stained book cases on either side of the arch between the dining room and living room; a tile fireplace; oak floor, and numerous casement windows, are some of the interesting details.

Upstairs there are three bedrooms, each having a different color scheme in ivory and green, carried out in the effect. There's a breakfast nook with an overhead arch. And, of course, there are plenty of built-in fixtures.
