## COPCO REPORT IS GROWTH INDEX IN DISTRICT SERVED

Local shareholders of the California Oregon Power company have just received an interesting quarterly report covering the activities of the Copco concern for the past three months. The report which accompanied the regular quarterly dividend on Copco preferred stock shows a complete growth and development and covers the following subjects of local interest:

**Construction**  
Line 29, the new 110,000 volt transmission line extending from Dixonville to Marshfield, a distance of approximately 65 miles, to connect the systems of the California Oregon Power company and Mountain States Power company, is practically completed and work on the new substations at Dixonville and Prospect is expected to be finished by the first of November.

Work of re-insulating line 12, which extends from Prospect to Springfield, to increase its capacity to 110,000 volts instead of 66,000 volts, has been completed. A large new substation is being planned for the city of Medford to take care of the continued increase in industrial business and to provide for future light and power demands of the important Medford territory. Work on this new substation will be started about November 15.

**Property Acquisitions**  
As of August 1, 1929 the municipally-owned light and water systems of the City of Oakland, Oregon, were purchased by the company.

**Always Lighting**  
In cooperation with the United States department of commerce, the company has recently completed a large number of line extensions to serve new air beaches and emergency landing fields located on the Pacific Airway in southern Oregon and northern California. A total of 35 beaches and 9 emergency landing fields, as well as the large new class A airport at Medford, Oregon, will be served by this company.

**Securities Formed**  
The California Oregon Power Securities company has been organized to deal in securities of the California Oregon Power company which are offered direct to customers and other residents of the territory served. At the present time the security offered is the 6 percent preferred stock, the price of which is \$101 a share. All transactions for the purchase or sale of the 6 percent preferred shares of the California Oregon Power company should be taken up direct with the California Oregon Power Securities company whose principal office is located in Medford, Oregon.

## Grants Pass Paper Worried About Ashland's Right to Lake o' Woods Road; Sinister Medford Move Seen

The following editorial in the Grants Pass Courier was evidently written and published with the view of dividing sentiment in Jackson county on the Dead Indian road matter, in hopes that such desired dissection would lessen the support of Medford and Jackson county in favor of the proposed new shorter Caves-Crest road:

"A prettier body of water than Lake of the Woods, hidden in deep timber near the southeastern base of McLaughlin Peak, or Mount Pitt, as it is known locally, would be hard to find. Here at an elevation of 5011 feet is a paradise for the lake fisherman and the speed boat fan.

"It is a paradise which comparatively few may enjoy. Cut off on both the Ashland and Klamath sides by mountain roads, considerable stretches of which are extremely poor, Lake of the Woods today hasn't a chance of being the resort it deserves to be.

"Ashland people, many of whom maintain summer homes on the wooded shores of this mountain gem, realize these limitations. They seek improvements of the Dead Indian road from Ashland to the lake so that citizens and tourists may enjoy its fishing, boating and beauty.

"Several weeks ago, when Medford people on a Caves road booster trip visited Ashland, it seemed that improvement of Ashland's road to the lake was in sight. The Medford chamber committee passed a resolution favoring completion of the Dead Indian road from Ashland to the lake rather than concentration on another direction.

## BEND VOTES CONFIDENCE IN COMMISSION BUDGET

BEND, Ore., Oct. 31.—(Special.)—The new commission form of government received a vote of confidence by the people of Bend, as shown in the budget election held here yesterday. The tax levy of \$52,549.50 for 1930 was approved by a vote of more than two to one. This was the first budget prepared under the commission manager form of government and was regarded as the first test of the new form.

## TRAFFIC OFFICER SHOWS FILMS TO EDUCATE DRIVERS

In accordance with a state-wide educational program for motorists and car owners, Lieutenant A. G. Nichols, supervisor of traffic in seven southern Oregon counties, was instrumental in bringing the first series of motion picture films by members of the state traffic department to Medford. They were shown at the Lions club luncheon yesterday through the courtesy of Honore Bronley, and will be presented before other service clubs and civic organizations in the city before being sent on to other towns in his district, according to Lieutenant Nichols.

The first reel, as yet unedited, depicts various kinds and causes of car accidents, methods of car thieves and the carelessness of owners who are the victims of thefts and the manner in which the traffic department runs down irregularities of every sort.

Although now only an experiment, it is the hope of the traffic department, said Mr. Nichols, to incorporate this "Safety Program" either into the regular school work, or school club work throughout the state. In this manner, it is believed that the number of deaths and accidents may be greatly reduced.

That the addition of 10 men to the state traffic department last year cut the expense of the department 20 per cent, and the fatalities 11 per cent was the statement of a state department head, as quoted by Mr. Nichols.
