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SAY NAVAL MAN VICTIM OF VAMPIRE

Canadian Woman Avowed Purpose Winning Affections Lieutenant Northcutt at Any Cost, Is Disclosed in Strange Disappearance Case—Held in Bremerton Yard.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 4.—(AP)—Naval officials have requested the commandant of the Puget Sound navy yard to obtain Lieut. Harold W. Northcutt's explanation of his disappearance from Norfolk a week ago, and Northcutt's statement may decide whether he will face a court martial.

The officer, who dropped out of sight October 22 with \$250 he had collected for the University of Virginia, is held at Bremerton, Wash., where he was found after a long search during which it was thought he might have been kidnapped, killed or injured.

Bureau of navigation officials said today they assumed Northcutt was being held for being absent without leave.

It was also said that the Puget Sound navy commandant, who is in Seattle, would probably question Northcutt about his disposition of the \$250 which he was reported to have collected from extension course students for the University of Virginia. Northcutt was thought to have gone to deliver this money to university authorities at the time of his disappearance.

Naval officials asserted they had not received the department of justice report on the case.

Found in Vancouver. Agents of the department of justice located Northcutt in Vancouver, B. C. He voluntarily went

to Seattle where yesterday he was formally placed under arrest and turned over to the navy at the Bremerton yard.

His father-in-law, H. E. C. Bryant, a Washington newspaperman, expressed extreme surprise, saying he had a fine naval record and was devoted to his wife and small son. At the same time, he disclosed that the justice department had been advised that a Canadian woman, whose name was not revealed, left her home in Ottawa last August for the purpose of winning the affections of Lieutenant Northcutt "at any cost."

Letters in the possession of the justice department show, he said, "for more than a year she boldly asserted" her aims.

KENTUCKY 'SHINER WOUNDED BY DRY MEN, FOUND DEAD

WHITESBURG, Ky., Nov. 4.—(AP)—The body of Ashland Collins, believed to have been engaged in a gun battle with prohibition officers yesterday, was found today near the scene of the shooting. He had been shot 12 times.

The fight, which occurred in a remote section, 20 miles from here, resulted in the serious wounding of Stephen K. Cornett, deputy sheriff and candidate for the office of sheriff. According to reports reaching here today, 25 shots were fired by Cornett, Collins and W. A. Creech, federal prohibition agent, who was with Cornett.

Collins was reported to have resisted search and to have shot down Cornett, who fired from the ground until struck a second time. Collins' body was left behind and Cornett was taken to a hospital at Fleming, Ky., where his condition was reported to be critical.

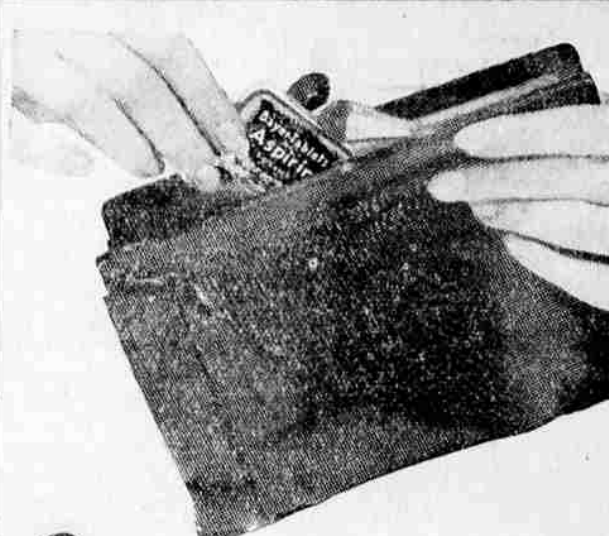

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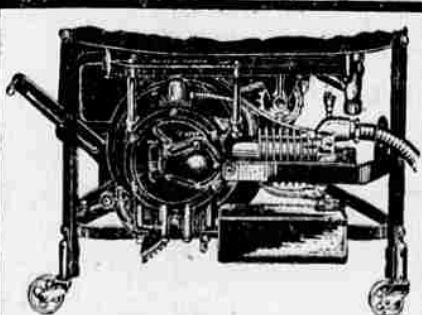
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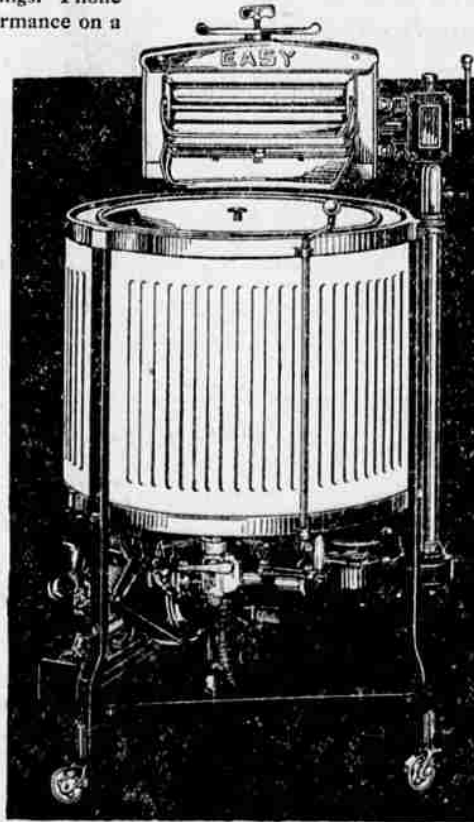
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
