

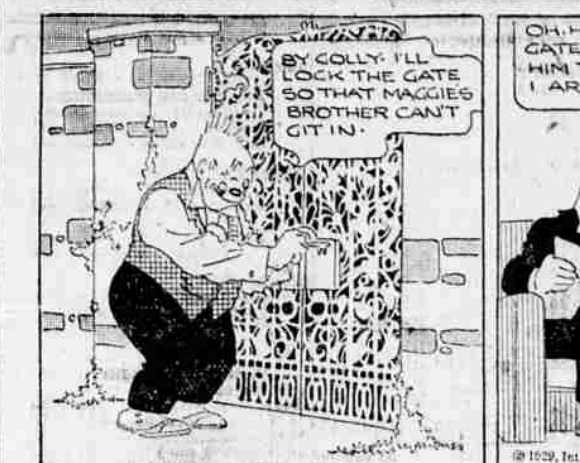
NO CHANGES NOTED

PORTLAND, Nov. 4.—(A)—Portland market quotations opened today with no changes in those quoted Friday. Butter prices appear steady following the recent decline and egg values show no indication of receding. Fresh eggs were in big demand. The most interesting development of the day was the release of the United States department of agriculture report on the Oregon onion crop. The total production is estimated at 75 cars, located as follows: Salem district 550 cars, Tualatin valley area 290, rest of state 25 cars. The crop consists almost wholly of Oregon yellow danvers.
