

EGG PRICES SOAR; BUTTER IS STEADY

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 6.—(AP) Egg prices are still soaring, with the fresh variety scarcer than ever. Quotations given out today by the Pacific Cooperative Poultry Producers show advances of two cents in fresh extras, three cents in standards, one cent in fresh mediums and two cents on fresh pullets. These were the prices to wholesalers. The prices to retailers were usually two cents additional.

Butter prices were steady at the Portland Produce exchange.

Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland Market News bureau of the United States department of agriculture says:

Another day of heavy apple receipts by motor truck was registered at the wholesale fruit and vegetable market today, with nearly 2,000 boxes trucked in from nearby districts. Much of this stock is going directly into storage, for consumption between now and New Year's.

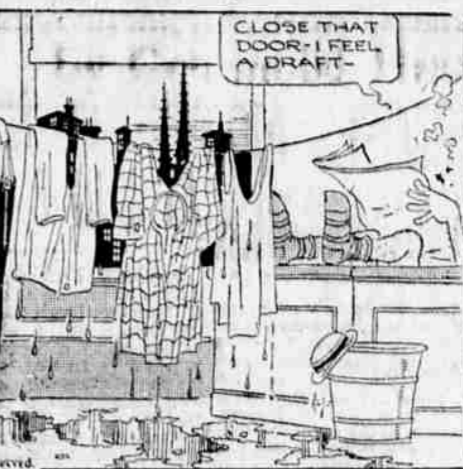
"College Love" to Be Craterian Talkie

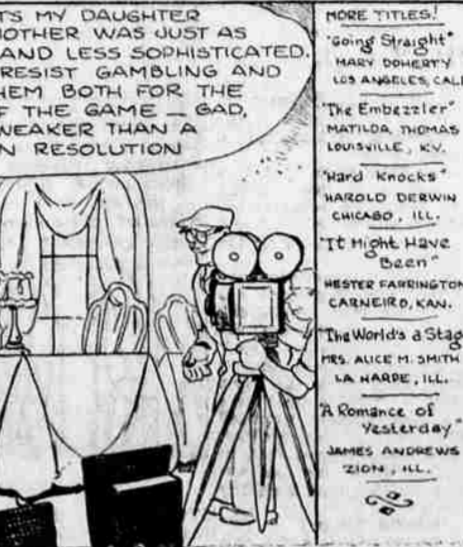
