Bill Lindsey of Merlin, owner of the Quajo wild turkey ranch, who was in Grants Pass Tuesday, stated that he now has at the farm about 300 wild turkeys and would be ready to sell them to the turkey growers in this vicinity later. The tame birds are made more vigorous by the cross-breeding. On June 1 of this year, Mr. Lindsey stated the game warden turned 10 hens and four toms loose down the river, and the birds were last reported to have raised several young ones in the vicinity in which they were turned loose. An objection to this birds, the grower said, is that they are susceptible to freight at night. Several birds were killed when they struck posts or trees while flying at night.—Grants Pass Courier.

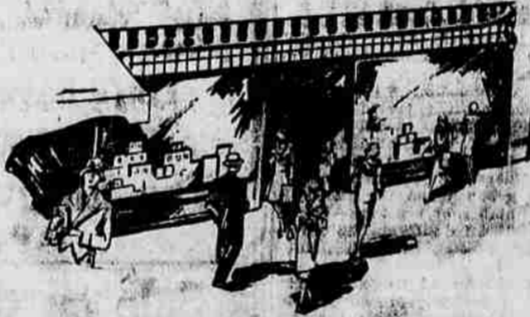
