

# S. P. TRAIN ROBBED BY A COWBOY

### Half Crazy Baker Cow Hand Identified As One of Bandits Who Wrecked and Robbed West Coast Limited—Dope Addict the Other—Expect Arres's.

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 12.—(AP)—Search is under way today for a former Baker ranch cow-hand, believed by investigators from the sheriff's office to have been the central figure in the wrecking and robbery of the Southern Pacific West Coast Limited near Saugus last Sunday night.

Captain Harry Brooks, of the sheriff's robbery detail, said a laundry mark on a torn coat, found near the wrecked train, had revealed the identity of the suspect. Other employees on the ranch, he said, had identified the coat as one belonging to a "half-crazed cowboy," who has been missing from the ranch since Sunday afternoon. The man's name was not revealed.

Brooks said he believed the second man described by passengers, who were robbed of between \$300 and \$500, was an escaped narcotic addict from Spadra state hospital.

That one of the robbers may have picked up a ride to Los Angeles shortly after the wrecking of the train was indicated by Tom Firth, who said a costless and hatless man accosted him near Saugus as he was returning to his home here from a Sunday automobile trip. The man told Firth he was a forest ranger and was in a hurry to get into Los Angeles to see his daughter, who had been injured and was in the children's hospital. Firth said he took the man, who gave the name of Hall, to the hospital, and was handed a \$5 bill, pulled from a big roll the asserted ranger carried in his pocket.

Firth said he became suspicious later, because the man described the wreck in detail during the ride to the city.

No ranger by the name of Hall is listed in forestry department records.

## MEDFORD HAS A REAL ARTIST IN MOVIE PAINTER

(By Mary Greiner) If Medford ever has a Bohemia, the little triangular art room recently fixed up by Jules Reisman, manager of the Craterian, should appropriately be a corner of it. Just how one gets in there is hard to remember after the first visit, but it is somewhere off the main entrance of the Cooley building.

For the management of the local Fox theatres has taken on an artist—and he, as well as his headquarters—is utterly colorful in costume. Art is his first name—also appropriately enough—and Mueller his family name. He is 22, tall and dark, and very sincere in his work. After talking with him and watching him work, it is no wonder that entrances and exits are obscured in the maze of color impressions one absorbs there.

Art Mueller hails from Portland, where he attended Jefferson high and won the admiration as well as the deep regard of both faculty and student body for his contributions to the artistic demands of that institution. Posters were his long suit, and he turned them out for every event imaginable.

After he left Jefferson he attended Neville Art school, where he learned the art of poster painting, and as a consequence attracted the notice not only of his teachers but of outside commercial art critics.

He was invited on the staff of the Fox theatres in Portland, which, like other large companies, have discarded the old fashioned displays for poster work. It was through the Portland theatres that Manager Reisman secured the services of this clever 22-year-old boy, who will give Medford what all the larger cities are getting in the theatre display work.

He has already completed five or six sets of theatre posters for the two local houses, having arrived in the city just a few days ago. One of the first of them was the group of dainty follies girls standing against vivid backgrounds of color and enticing the crowds into the Craterian offering for this week until tomorrow—"The Hollywood Revue."

"Three Live Ghosts," in anemic pastel water colors—pale lavender, yellow and green—were thinly quivering on another poster outside the Rialto theatre today.

The story of the picture is told in the press sheets—the title—and an artistic imagination. These are the three sources from which the Portland boy conceives his ideas for posters. Sometimes it's just the mood he catches while reading a press sheet, and his pictures are utterly impressionistic.

In his little three-cornered studio are some of the pieces brought from Portland—Lon Chaney done in brown oils, a cap set over on one side of his head, and a cigarette, the smoke of which drifts off into a wisp of form, held in one hand. Mr. Mueller prefers to work in oils when he isn't pressed for time, and he will use them often in his displays for the Craterian, he says. This theatre will feature principally the likeness of the stars in the features. The Rialto, where action pictures are shown, the story will be emphasized.

Art Mueller likes Medford, and, having plenty of work here to keep him busy, he hopes to stay a long, long time.

**Radio Firm Gives Cure for Distorted Radio Reception**
