

CHEAPER TURKEYS FOR THANKSGIVING

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 18.—(AP)—Indications point to cheaper prices for turkeys this Thanksgiving than last year, according to quotations of a leading produce company today.

The only stock for which there seems to be demand was the No. 1. The lack of demand for the lower grades is shown in the cheaper prices. The live birds are of unusually poor quality at 13 and 20c.

Shippers were asked to get their fancy birds on the market by Friday or Saturday morning at the latest, as much of the Thanksgiving demand will be filled this week-end.

BUTTER PRICES HOLD FIRM IN BEST GRADES

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 18.—(AP)—In the absence of a meeting of the Portland Produce Exchange Saturday, the butter market held steady over the week-end. Prices were firm today for the better grades.

Fresh extra eggs are still scarce and firm, but no further change has been announced by the Pacific co-operative poultry producers.

The fruit and vegetable situation was also unchanged.

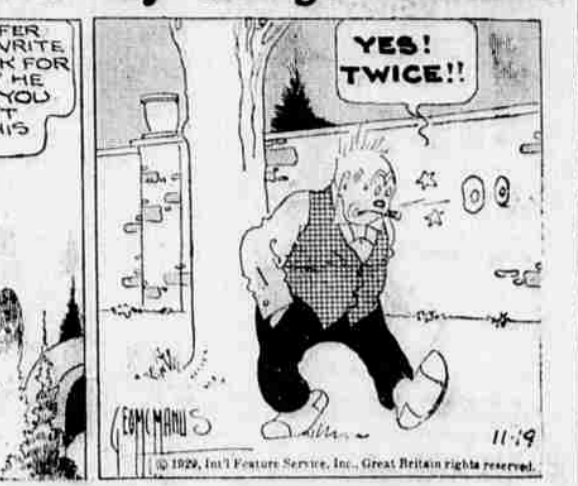

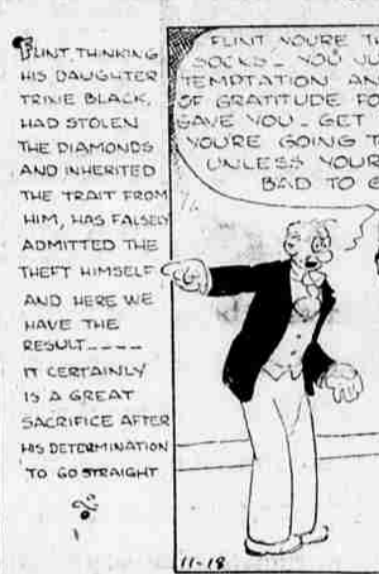
