LONDON, Nov. 27.—(AP)—The Daily Express in a dispatch from Bombay today, said infant brides were being rushed to the altar by the hundreds in some parts of India to forestall the law prohibiting child marriage, which becomes effective in April.

Several child marriages have been solemnized in Bombay the last few days, while in Surat it was estimated 2,000 such marriages have occurred recently.
