HULL, Mass., Nov. 29.—(AP)—Some of the features of the summer resort of Nantasket beach were in ashes today. Flames fanned by a 40-mile an hour wind swept the excursion fleet and pier yesterday, destroying five steamers, adjoining water front structures, the state bath house and three dwellings with a loss of \$2,000,000.
