SEE LOSSES ILL HEALTH IN TRAGEDY

Prominent Chicago Executive Slays Wife and Takes Own Life As Hour Near to Attend Thanksgiving Dinner at Home of Friends — Heavy Stock Losses Indicated.

CHICAGO, Nov. 29.—(AP)—There were two motives offered today to explain the Thanksgiving day double tragedy in the Gold Coast apartment of the James Barrett Paulsey: ill health and market losses. Paulsey shot his wife as she sat working a cross-word puzzle. He then entered the bathroom and killed himself with the same revolver.

Both had been in ill health for some time, and there was evidence that they had suffered heavy losses in the stock market. There was nothing, however, to indicate that murder and suicide had been contemplated, and police today were still trying to find out what particular incident prompted Paulsey to act just at the time the couple were preparing to attend a Thanksgiving day dinner at the home of friends.

Paulsey's physician said the middle-aged coal company executive was seriously ill several months ago.

Heavy Losses. Likewise, a cursory examination of Paulsey's stock accounts did not indicate that their losses had been ruinous, even though they were considerable. Friends of Paulsey said they did not believe he could be rated as wealthy. They spoke of him as well to do with a comfortable salary income.

Paulsey had been prominent socially in Chicago for many years. His wife, the former Elinor Ludlow, was a niece of the late Gov. Asa Bushell of Ohio. She was a famed beauty and once was reported engaged to Capt. Richmond P. Hobson, a hero of the Spanish-American war.

Paulsey had been prominent in the coal mining industry for many years and until a few years ago was a director of the Deering Coal company. He was an executor of the \$2,000,000 estate of the late James K. Deering.

IRISH HAVE NO USE FOR EUROPEAN UNION

DUBLIN.—(AP) Discussion of the proposed United States of Europe, with a view to a holiday from tariffs, has revealed general approval of the attitude assumed at Geneva by the Free State representative. The Free State has no objection to a United States of Europe provided this country is allowed to go its own way. Its efforts to establish the native industries must be guided by the special circumstances of the country.

A United States of Europe, argued the Irish, cannot be directed against America. The old Unionist Press in the Free State, while admitting the possible advantages of a European Zollverein, regards it as impracticable. It suggests instead a British imperial customs agreement with a beginning in the British Isles by a customs union of Britain, northern Ireland and the Free State.

GERMAN FIRMS SEEK RUSSIAN CONCESSIONS

MOSCOW.—(AP) Germany was ahead of the United States this year in the number of bids submitted for concessions within the Soviet Union. Of the 270 tenders made from foreign sources 72 came from Germany and 69 from the United States.

The chief concessions committee was especially interested in noting that there were 26 English bids in the list. Last year only seven came from the United Kingdom.

LAVISH SETTINGS FEATURE SCENES BROADWAY TALKIE

"Broadway," the original and probably the best of the all talking and singing night club melodramas with its grandiose and indescribable gorgeousness in the night club scenes, photographed in Technicolor, much pleased the Thanksgiving day audiences at the Craterian theater where the attraction opened yesterday. It ran after noon and night until Sunday.

It is a thrilling, gun-barking, rival bootlegging Evelyn Brent and hijacking, and small-time hooper night club melodrama that thrills and fairly grips you with intense interest while at the same time entertaining with unusual photographic effects. A Fox movie-tone news and a singing act, "The Night Victor Artists," gives variety to the bill.

There is nothing unusual about the plot, however—the novelty comes in the way the story is enacted, including some very marked character portrayals, the lack of good comedy trimmings and the lavishness and elaborateness of the night club stage scenes. The dining and dancing floor is claimed to be the most elaborate ever constructed for such scenes in a movie and the effect on the audience of immensity is heightened by trick photography and settings. At times the scenes move so fast in kaleidoscopic activity as to almost bewilder.

"Broadway" is the story of a liquor gang feud centering in a night club, into which a couple of innocent and ambitious hoopers are deeply entangled, and after two gangster killings are finally freed to love in peace ever after.

Glenn Tyron and Merna Kennedy in the male and female leads, while good are not so much, but Evelyn Brent who is co-starred in "Broadway" with Tyron, gives one of her characteristic and artist interpretations of a hard-boiled, resourceful, spirited and sultry chorus girl. However, James E. Jackson with his slow drawing manner of speech, immobile countenance and pleasing personality fairly walks away with the acting honors of the show, in his characterization of Dan McCorm, detective of the homicide squad.

There is a very large cast of principals and others in the support of the above mentioned leading characters. R. A. K.
