DRIEST NOVEMBER BUREAU'S HISTORY

The month just closed was the driest November in Jackson county in the history of the local weather bureau. There was rain on only one day and the total was barely more than a trace—2 one-hundredths of an inch. Last November the rainfall fell below the November average of 1.32 inches when the total was 1.11, but the fall had been a fairly moist one. This year, however, since September 1 there has only been a total precipitation of 1.16 inches.

ROSEBURG, Ore., Dec. 2.—(AP)—The three months of September, October and November constituted the driest fall Roseburg had known during the 55 years the government weather bureau has been located in this city. E. H. Fletcher, meteorologist, said today.

The total rainfall for November was .25 of an inch.

MARSHFIELD, Ore., Dec. 2.—(AP)—Heavy fogs which rolled in off the southern Oregon coast during the last two nights and drenched the fire-dotted forests of two counties today had aided materially hundreds of fire fighters to control a dozen blazes which blackened more than 3,000 timbered acres and threatened ranches and villages.

F. R. Walsh, fire warden, said today that all fires in Coos county had been halted either by the efforts of fire fighters or by the fogs which enveloped the country and mingled with smoke over a white area out to sea.

RECOVER BODIES SIX COAL MINERS

WEST FRANKFORT, Ill., Dec. 2.—(AP)—The charred bodies of six coal miners killed in an explosion early yesterday in Old Ben mine No. 8, near here, had been recovered today, but rescuers still sought the body of a seventh victim, who, mine officials said, was certain to have perished.

The explosion was localized in an automatically released shale dust to extinguish flames, and it is believed by officials to have saved the lives of 15 other miners, the remainder of a crew that was tearing up tracks in the north part of the mine, preparatory to abandonment.
