UNDERTONE WEAK EGGS AND BUTTER

PORTLAND, Dec. 3.—(AP)—Eggs and butter prices remained unchanged, although there was a distinct undertone of weakness in the egg market.

Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland bureau of the United States department of agriculture says:

Caulliflower production was markedly aided by last week's rains and warmer weather.

Heavy shipments of mixed vegetables have considerably depleted supplies of good quality bunched carrots, beets, and other vegetable crops.

Potato and onion markets are dull. Of the 20 acres of potatoes marketed at Portland last week, possibly 50 per cent were unsold.

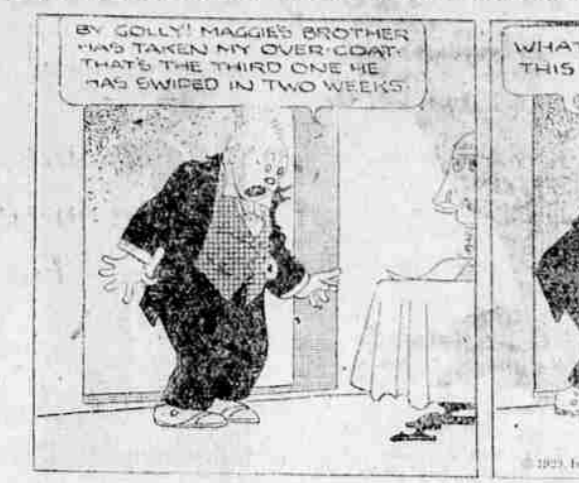

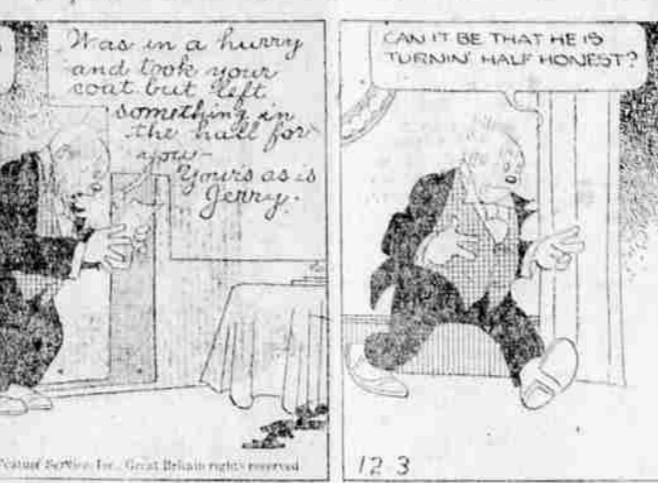
