PEIPING—(AP) Gasoline driven tractors are to replace camels on a desert expedition being organized by French and Chinese scientists to cover unexplored parts of North China and Indo-China next year.

The purpose of the trip is to carry on scientific research and to be conducted jointly by the National Scientific Union of China and the Citroen Motor Car company of France.

CHRISTMAS BRINGING WORLD PEACE NEARER

Peace and good will upon earth, which usually in the past has been a Christmas pose which passed as the holly withered, is actually nearer this Christmas than ever before. In the autumn of 1925, current comment was that the peace movements of the time lacked cohesion. In 1927, the situation was like the children's chant, "getting ready to start to commence to begin." Three months later the dismal failure of the Geneva peace conference was featured in the news. In March, 1928, statesmen were predicting another world war within ten years, and in October of that year the Kellogg pact was being regarded as a pact even in America.

WHY TIRE COLORS CHANGE TO BLACK

"Practically every trade and industry has burst into a bloom of color during the last few years. Meanwhile the tire trade has changed from white to black. Most motorists believe the glossy black tires now seen everywhere were chosen for reasons of fashion. White black, in the opinion of the great majority, does go better with the colorful bodies of stylish motor cars, the real purpose being the tire color change is utility," says Sam Jennings of the Jennings Tire company, local Fisk dealer.

Pure rubber gum would make very poor wearing tire material. Wear in a tire is caused by mixing pigments with the pure gum. In former days the pigment commonly used was zinc oxide and the resulting rubber compound was white. Engineers and chemists, working together, have found that carbon black gives a much more durable material than zinc oxide. So carbon black has come into general use, with the double result that better wearing tires are produced and the glossy black hue makes a better appearance in combination with the daring colors employed by the body builders.

Invention to Detect Hit-and-Run Motorists

"Please arrest me," is, in effect, the message conveyed by a new German invention designed to aid the police in capturing "hit-and-run" automobile drivers. The moment a car hits a person or another vehicle, the device, located under the chassis, is said to raise a white plate with a winking red light above the license plate, and also automatically to disconnect and lock the speedometer, thus showing the rate of speed at which the car was traveling at the time of the accident.
