The seal sale went "over the top."

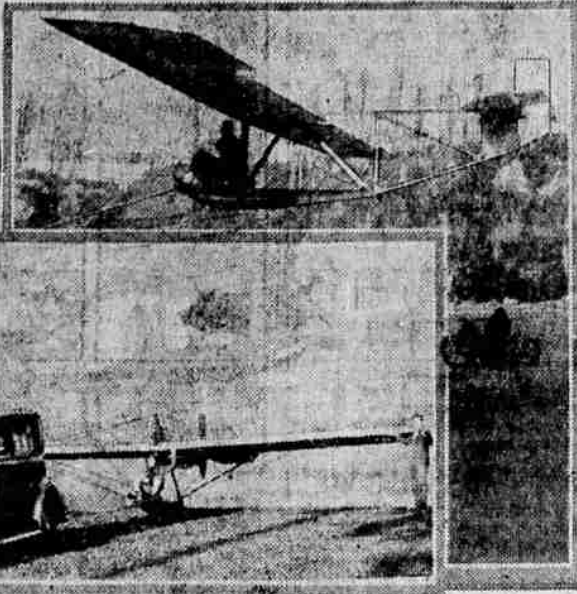
