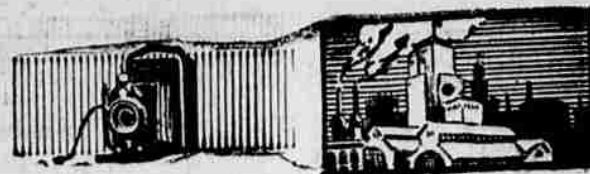


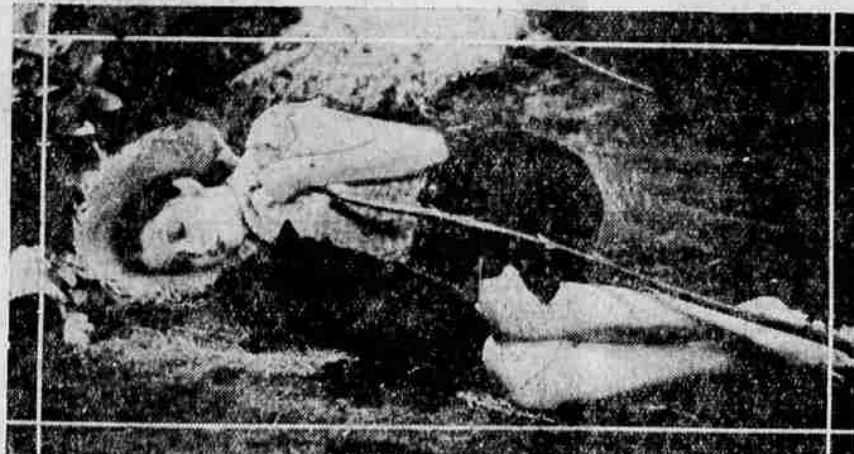
# CAMERAGRAMS

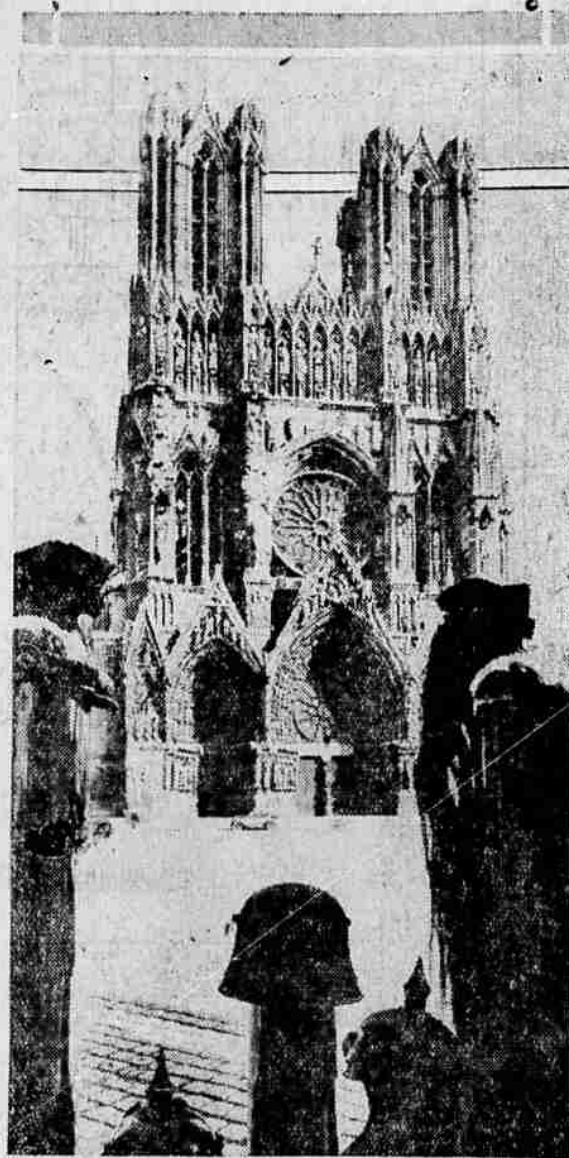
**WHO WOULDN'T PLAY HOOKEY** to go fishing with Billie Dove, shown here in the "Barefoot Boy" motif.
