Cooper went to Grinnell college in Iowa, where he was found wanting when he tried out for the college troopers' society. In Hollywood, he's a star. Miss Bruce never went to college, but in high school in Fargo, N. D., she, too, essayed dramatics without Virginia Bruce success. Somebody else got the role, leaving Virginia to come to Hollywood with no stage experience other than that of the debating platform.

She arrived with her aunt, intending to enroll in a local university, but meanwhile she met Director William Baendlin, who told her to try pictures. She worked as an extra a little while, and recently won a bit which led to a studio contract. She is soft-spoken, has a good singing voice and has played and sung in several talkies already—all they bill, she depreciates.

"I'd like to become a star, but I don't know that I have enough ambition or artistic zeal," she says. "The main advantage, as I see it, would be money enough to buy all the clothes—and books—I want. But then, on the other hand, to have to walk in a perpetual spotlight, in public, as the stars do—I wouldn't like to do that."
