No one seemed to notice them. That was natural. Everyone was interested in the circus.

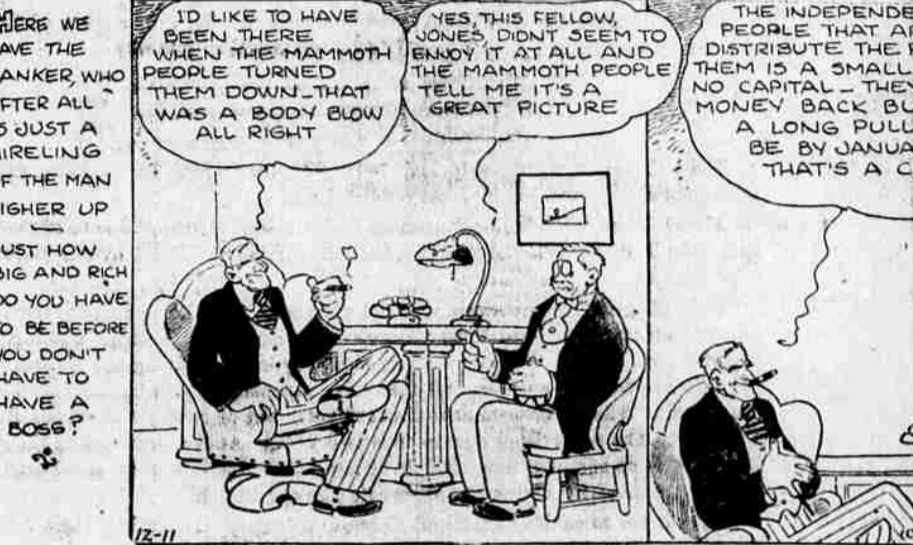
It didn't seem possible that they were way up in the air. Why, as Peggy said, it even had the dear, good, old familiar smell of a regular circus!

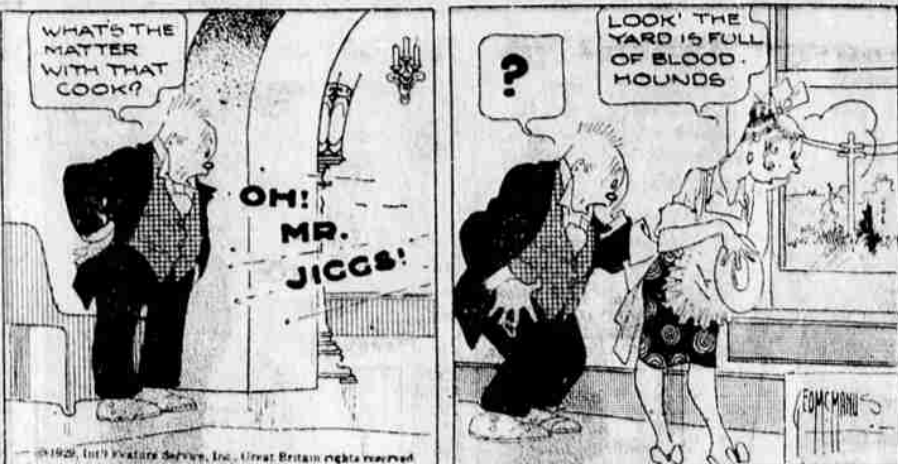
