PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 12.—(AP) Butter prices were materially lower on the Portland Produce Exchange today. Extras and standards were clipped for declines of three cents each, prime firsts four cents and first one cent.

Butterfat prices tumbled likewise, the cut averaging about four cents. Eggs were weaker with extras quoted at 44c to 46c and standards at 43c to 44c.
