ASSASSINATION ATTEMPT FAILS

NEW DELHI, India, Dec. 23.—(AP)—An attempt today to assassinate Lord Irwin, viceroy for India, failed when a bomb placed on the railroad tracks 10 miles from here exploded before a coach containing the viceroy and his party passed over. One man was injured in the explosion of the bomb which occurred beneath the dining car, which the vice-regal party had left only a few minutes before. The train did not even halt but continued to Delhi, where Lord Irwin had important appointments with leading Indian nationalists, among them Mahatma Gandhi. After speaking to the injured man he left immediately for his official residence.

ONE DEAD WHEN BIG PLANE HITS STUMP AT PORT

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., Dec. 23.—(AP)—Officials of the Transcontinental Air Transport lines began an investigation here today in an effort to establish the cause of the crash of one of its tri-motored passenger planes here early last night which brought death to one passenger and serious injury to two others. D. C. Law, 47, of Philadelphia, Pa., member of the technical staff of Warner Brothers, Inc., motion picture producer, was fatally injured. C. Mahlon Kline, also of Philadelphia, suffered a broken right arm and severe body bruises. The other injured was Miss Mary Fournier, secretary to Donald Harrison, assistant manager of the T. A. T. She suffered from a strained back and shock. The plane, flying eastward from St. Louis to Columbus, Ohio, reached Stout field, Mars Hill airport, shortly after 5 o'clock. Pilot D. W. Burford of Columbus circled the field and as he attempted to set the ship down it was thought that he miscalculated its speed, and that, added to the slick, icy condition of the field, caused the plane to coast to the extreme end of the landing area. The ship struck a five-foot stump, the impact throwing through the fuselage, breaking the left longeron, a main piece of the framework.

Berkeley, Calif., Dec. 23.—(AP)—Extremely simple ceremonies will mark the wedding here at noon today of Helen Wills and Frederick S. Moody, Jr., San Francisco stockbroker. In picturesque little St. Clement's chapel, at the foot of the Berkeley hills, the Rev. Lindley H. Miller will read the Episcopalian marriage service which eliminates the word "obey." Besides Dr. Miller and the bride and groom, only six persons will be present. They are the bride's parents, Dr. and Mrs. C. A. Wills, Mr. and Mrs. Frederick Moody, Sr., and Mr. and Mrs. Corbett Moody, the bridegroom's brother and sister-in-law.

Reports are that the tennis champion and her husband will leave immediately after the services aboard Cyril Tobin's yacht Galatea, but the honeymoon plans were a carefully guarded secret today. "Little Poker Face" lived up to her name yesterday. Apparently not a bit perturbed at her coming nuptials, Miss Wills spent the morning on the courts of the Berkeley Tennis club. LONDON, Dec. 23.—(AP)—It is rumoured in London that the young New Zealander who was shot out of an airplane to break flight records in Australia, Saturday, may be made a forest landing in the tiny bush near the wreckage near Tripoli, northern Africa. His machine was damaged slightly but he was unhurt.

Today, however, even worse news awaited him. A telegram from New Zealand said his wife died suddenly Saturday. Efforts are being made to inform the airman of his bereavement.
