

VEAL AND LIGHT HENS TAKE SLIGHT ADVANCE

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 28.—(AP)—Prices of veal, and the lighter hens have advanced slightly. Veal is 1c higher at 18c and light hens 1c more at 18 1/2c. Broilers are almost unobtainable at 20c. Egg and butter prices were unchanged. Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the United States department of commerce says: "With retailers, the probably consumers still fairly well stocked with leftover Christmas supplies, little fruit and vegetable activity is expected on the wholesale market."

Wall Street Report

NEW YORK, Dec. 28.—(AP) Extensive year-end readjustment of speculative accounts imparted a decidedly reactionary trend to prices in today's stock market. The selling centered largely in the merchandise, baking and public utility issues, many of which were hammered down 1 to 3 points. Although several blocks of 5000 to 10,000 shares changed hands, the volume of trading was relatively light.
Ward Baking preferred sustained the largest individual loss in today's market, dropping 8 points. Extreme declines of 3 to 4 points were also registered by Columbian Carbon, National Biscuit (old stock), May Department Stores, Safeway Stores, Magna Copper and J. I. Case, U. S. Steel common sold down 2 points before it met effective buying support.
The closing was heavy. Total sales approximated 1,350,000 shares.
