

BUTTER DIVES IN PORTLAND DEALS

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 3.—(AP) Following yesterday's decline in eggs, butter and butterfat prices hit the downward trail at the Portland produce exchange today.

Advances were announced in the prices of veal and pork by a leading produce company. Veal went up to 18 and 19c, and pork moved up to 45 and 18c.
