EUGENE, Ore., Jan. 3.—(P)—Mrs. B. A. Cotton of Coburg saved the life of her infant child Wednesday by holding it high above the water after the automobile in which they were riding skidded off the highway near Corvallis and plunged into a ditch filled with water and pinned the occupants underneath.

### CENTRAL POINT YOUTH CITED TO GRAND JURY

In Judge Taylor's court, Chester Thompson, a Central Point youth of 18 years, whose case has been pending since December 20th last, on the charge of forgery, was arraigned this forenoon. He waived examination and was bound over to the grand jury under bond of \$250.

The boy is accused of having passed a forged check of \$24.62, to which was signed the name of F. E. Utson, on the first National Bank of Medford, on December 20th.

### PHILIPPINE BOUNDARY CONVENTION CONFIRMED

WASHINGTON, Jan. 3.—(P)—Secretary Stimson and Sir Esme Howard, the British ambassador, have signed a convention between the United States and Great Britain limiting definitely the boundary line between the Philippine archipelago and the state of North Borneo.

The convention confirmed the boundary line established by Great Britain and Spain, while the latter owned the Philippines, prior to the treaties of 1898 and 1900, under which the United States acquired the archipelago.

### LA GRANDE HOTEL TO ADD SEVEN STORIES

LA GRANDE, Ore., Jan. 3.—(P)—Julius Roesch, owner of Sacajawea inn, announced today a seven-story building project adjacent to the hotel and connecting with the main building through an overhead hallway or tunnel over the intervening alley. Four stories or more will be erected this year.

### KING ALFONSO APPROVES REORGANIZATION PLANS

MADRID, Jan. 3.—(P)—Premier Primo de Rivera today announced that King Alfonso had approved a "political plan" looking toward reorganization of the patriotic union and that later on a national plan would be submitted for a national government presumably to replace the present dictatorship.
