Hugh B. Rankin, supervisor of the Crater national forest, has promised to cooperate with the Garden club in sponsoring the campaign by loaning a truck and man to work on the highways running through the national forest. He will also designate a dumping ground in that territory.

Following the business meeting last night members of the club were addressed by Ben Bionex of Grants Pass on the subject of bulb growing. Mr. Bionex spoke particularly of the culture of gladiolus, tulip and iris bulbs. He brought a display of tulips with him.
