JACKSON COUNTY TIMBER CRUISER NAMED BY COURT

A. E. Elder of North Bend, was selected by the county court today to have charge of the timber cruise of Jackson county, for which the 1930 budget appropriated \$10,500. The cruise is for the purpose of fixing a more equitable basis for timber assessments. A soil survey is also planned.

Elder will start work as soon as he can assemble his force, and will have three crews at work. Elder has had large experience in timber cruising in Coos and other coast counties. He will have complete charge of the work.

The matter has been before the county court for several weeks, and they acted after conferences with the county assessor, and the state tax commission.
