

CONFESSES MURDERING PARAMOUR

"She deceived me," Pitt told police. "I just grabbed her by the throat and choked her when I found it out."

Mrs. Jacobs, nee Pearl Lambert, had three children whose custody was given to their father, Milton Jacobs, Portland, Ore., engraver, after the divorce. She is also survived by a sister-in-law, Mrs. A. A. Lambert of 3255 Turner street, Vancouver, Wash.

DRY REPEAL IS FAVORED BY MORROW

Senatorial Candidate Says Conditions After 10 Years Trial Deplorable—Restoration State Power Over Rum Needed.

NEWARK, N. J., May 16.—(AP)—Dwight W. Morrow, ambassador to Mexico, who is seeking the Republican nomination for the United States senate, favors repeal of the 18th amendment and a return to state control of liquor traffic.

In a speech last night in Krueger's auditorium, he described conditions after 10 years of federal prohibition as deplorable. "It is not fair to assume," he said, "that all resentment against national prohibition is due to a desire for unlimited license to be intemperate. There is no community in the United States that desires that. The resentment is due to the feeling that an unreasonable control is being imposed.

"States or subdivisions of states whose sympathy is not with the law feel themselves relieved of responsibility for enforcement. They leave to an overburdened federal government, with a wholly inadequate police force, the task of carrying out a great social reform which before 1920 all the communities of the land, in one way or another were wrestling with.

Has No Panacea.

"I bring you no panacea for this deplorable condition. I know of no magical solution. I cannot, however, stand before my friends and neighbors and ask for their suffrage without having them know my attitude toward this problem.

"First I believe that the way out of the present difficulty is to recognize clearly the fundamental difference between the nature of the federal government and the state government. I believe this involves a repeal of the 18th amendment and the substitution thereof of an amendment which will restore to the states the power to determine their policy toward the liquor traffic and vest in the federal government power to give all possible protection and assistance to those states that desire complete prohibition against invasion from the states that do not."
