

BOY SCOUT HEAD ADDRESSES MEET CRATER COUNCIL

Walter J. Hayward associate regional executive for Oregon, Washington, Montana and Idaho, gave the principal address at the Boy Scout Dinner held in Ashland last night for all men working in the scout movement in the territory of the Crater Lake council, which includes Jackson and Josephine counties. Mr. Hayward emphasized the fact that the scouting program was an out-of-doors program.

"It is quite customary in American life today to count up resources— to speak of wealth actually in terms of real property, while the real resources, the real economic assets, are human assets," he said. "I find it difficult to think of boys in terms of economic assets; beyond all of that we are dealing with soul stuff which cannot be measured in dollars and cents."
