

MARTHA GASCH NEW PRESIDENT OF B. & P. CLUBS

Salem Named For 1931 Convention — Officers For Year Elected—Dele- gates Will Hold Session In Grants Pass Today.

Miss Martha Gasch of Portland, elected president of the Oregon Federation of Business and Professional Women's clubs to succeed Miss Cecilia Beyler of Astoria, retiring president, at the afternoon session of the tenth annual state convention at the Elks temple yesterday, will be installed this morning at the ceremonial in Grants Pass, Mrs. Maud Chapman, president of the Medford club, will be installed as first vice president of the state federation; Emma Drain of Eugene as second vice president; May Griffin of Portland, corresponding secretary; Josephine Bothman of Corvallis, recording secretary, and Ora Renner of Oregon City, treasurer.

Directors elected for the coming year are La Verne Hardwick of McMinnville, Elizabeth Helpline of Roseburg, Leona Bryant of Coquille, Jane E. Olson of Pendleton and Josephine Schade of Salem.

Salem was chosen place for the meeting of the eleventh annual convention of the Oregon Federation of Business and Professional Women's clubs in 1931 by unanimous vote.

Members of visiting clubs and the Medford group will leave Hotel Medford for Grants Pass at 7:30 this morning taking the scenic route to that city, where a breakfast will be served at 9:00 a. m. At 10:30 the ceremony for installation of officers will open. This will be followed by a joint meeting of the executive council. At the close of which the convention, which has been described as the most successful one for women ever held in southern Oregon, will end to convene again in 1931.

Delegates and state officers will leave Grants Pass on the afternoon train for their various destinations.

The presentation of the Three Arts Revue, "Two Feet High," prologue of which opened at 8:30 at the Medford armory was preceded by the last social affair of the Medford program, the informal district banquet at Hotel Medford, which took the form of a general get-together for members of all clubs. Miss Cecilia M. Beyler, retiring state president, presided.

One of the most clever features of the program was a ukelele novelty stunt put on by a group from Medford's club, composed of Mrs. Elsie Brown, Miss Dorothy Baucum, Mrs. Grace Voss, Misses Edna Mae Wells, Clarice Benschoter, Marion Mercer and Winifred Walker. Dressed in befitting costumes they entered the banquet room playing and singing, "Hall, Dear Old Medford, You're the Best Town on the Coast," and several other popular songs.

Others numbers on the program were: Violin solo by John R. Knight, Jacksonville, accompanist, Miss Ruth Severance; recitals of district chairman, north Willamette, Miss Augusta Hahn, eastern, Miss Jane Olson; group songs, Mrs. Beulah Belle Smith, Hillsboro; south Willamette, Miss Josephine Bothman; Coos Bay, Miss Bernice Mirraoui; southern, Mrs. Leda B. Parker.

'TWO FEET HIGH' BY LOCAL AUTHORESS, PROVES PLEASING

We're glad they decided to present "Two Feet High" in the armory and let the public in—too many people would otherwise have been cheated.

Among the surprises of the show we're going to list the acrobatic tap dance given by Douglas Fox and La Nore Gilliland's interpretation of the love number, "Take Time to Be Happy," sung by William Kirkpatrick. Because we didn't know, in spite of all we've heard, that Medford really is as natural as the trees and over-looked so many encores from an intelligent audience. We only wish there had been more.

Hector Fox, the office boy, who would have preferred to keep his feet on the desk all the time, also made his local debut last night. He has participated in amateur theatricals in Portland and they trained him well by there.

To get down to the old favorites—Jo Murray Rostel was quite as natural as the tired and over-worked business woman as she has often been in more vivacious parts. Versatility is to be added to the many qualities for which she has been admired on the stage. After she got her feet on the desk the rest of the office forces didn't have a prayer.
