CIRCUS PAY DAY MONEY SPENT IN MEDFORD SHOPS

While the hundreds of employees of the A. G. Barnes circus, which played here yesterday and departed late last night for Roseburg in which city it is showing today, lived on the circus train, others on the mess tent, nevertheless they spent much money in Medford, as did also the management.

This was due to the fact that last Saturday night was pay day for the circus, which played Klamath Falls that day, and Montague, Cal., Sunday, and consequently the employees who were flush with money had no place to spend it until Medford was reached. As soon as they could get off duty, especially the performers, they flooded the stores on shopping expeditions making purchases of various kinds, and many of them sent money to their homes in various parts of the United States and even foreign countries, visiting the postoffice and purchasing money orders for this purpose.

Some very large sums were sent out from the city in this way. Among the performers sending money home or to former homes abroad were the Great Gretones, the young group of high wire performers giving the super-feature act of the circus, which is one of the best and most hazardous acts ever seen with any circus attraction. The midget performers were also among those sending money away to their homes.

Then too, much money was spent in the city in purchasing meat, groceries and other food for the menagerie, and the circus mess tent, and outside lunch and other refreshment stands, hay for the many horses and other animals, and for various needed sundries.

The circus management, too, paid into the city treasury \$100 for the license to show in Medford for the one day.

Therefore in spite of the fact that the hotels and restaurants obtained no direct patronage from the circus, the latter left considerable money in town.
