RURAL ELECTRIC COSTS LOWERED

SALEM, Ore., May 23.—(AP)—The burden of cost of electrical extensions into rural communities is much lessened for the consumer by a new policy adopted by the state public service commission. The order requires utilities to make the extensions without cost to the subscriber if the cost is not in excess of \$75. If the cost exceeds that amount to pay the utility the cost with a deduction of \$75, either in cash or by a "minimum monthly revenue" over a five-year period. The order is effective June 15.

UKIAH, Cal., May 23.—(AP)—Abraham James, one of a party of four Indians, was shot to death near here early today and Joe Martinez, 47, a rancher, was taken into custody when the victim's companions named him as the attacker.

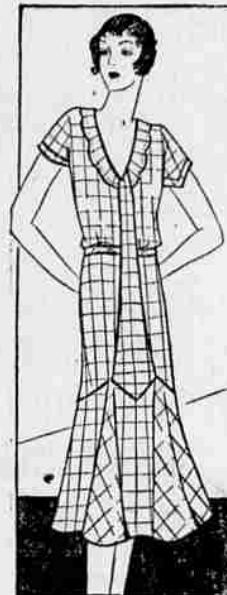

Few Foods Return Such High Caloric Value for the Money

Sugar is an inexpensive food. Compared with butter, bacon, macaroni, bread, meats, milk, green vegetables and fresh fruits, sugar supplies the system with far more calories for each cent spent than the same amount expended on any of the rest of the products named.
