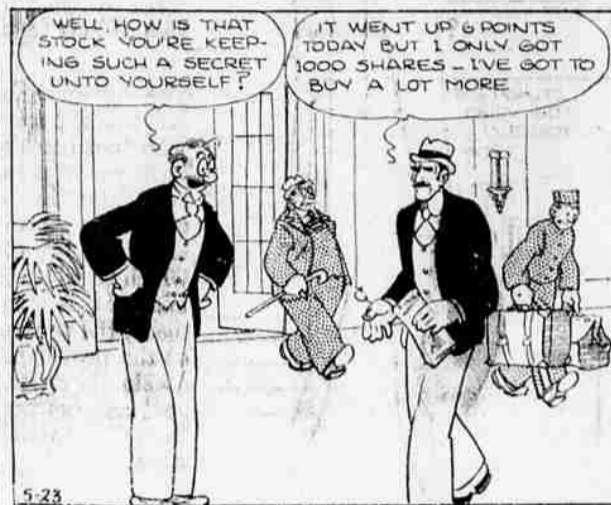
MRS. MARTIN AGAIN BRINGING UP FATHER
