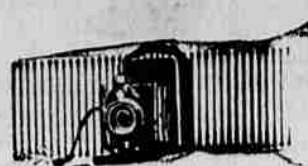


# CAMERAGRAMS

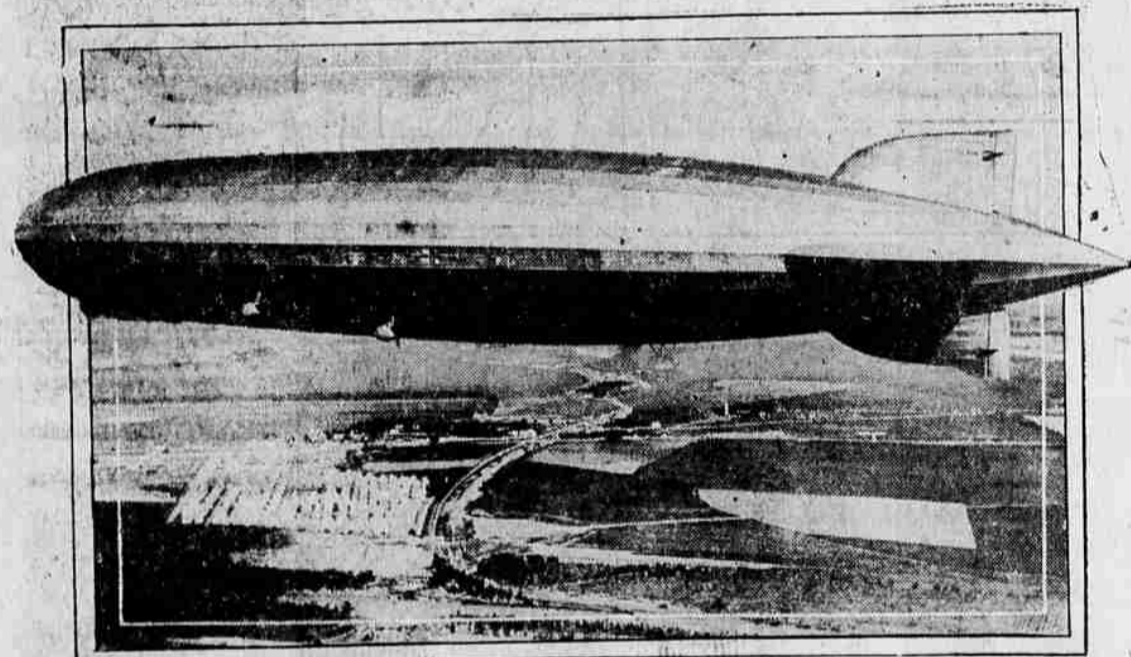
