BUTTER REDUCED IN PORTLAND AS RECEIPTS SWELL

PORTLAND, Ore., May 27.—(AP) Butter and butterfat prices hit the toboggan for further material declines at the produce exchange today.

All grades of butter were reduced one cent and butterfat two cents. This makes extras in butter 32c and butterfat 31c delivered Portland.

The standard salad vegetables—lettuce and tomatoes—are more plentiful and are cheaper. Green peas are arriving from The Dalles and Roseburg mostly, but local peas will replace these soon.

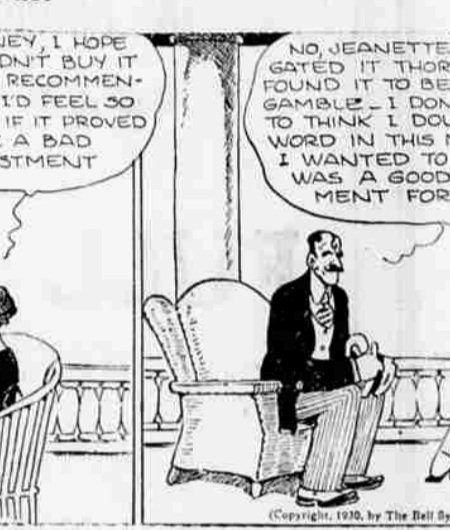
