

# ROTARIANS GET ROGUE HISTORY FROM DANIELS

History of commercial fishing in Rogue river, starting with its beginning in 1875, was told members of the Rotary club at the regular luncheon at Hotel Medford today noon by T. E. Daniels of the Jackson County Game Protective association, one of the leading sponsors of the petition to place the Rogue river fishing amendment on the ballot for the November election.

Even back in 1875, Mr. Daniels told his audience, the small amount of fish commercially speaking, realized by the man, who established the first cannery on the Rogue. An effort for artificial propagation was immediately made and the hatcheries established.

With the amount of illegal fishing going on, which has continued on the lower Rogue for years, Mr. Daniels showed, the hatcheries are unable to keep the river replenished.

Packing Continued.

Because the authorities have not stopped illegal fishing, sportsmen of the state and other persons interested in conservation of Ore-

gon's resources are desiring to stop commercial fishing through passage of the Rogue river fishing amendment.

K. J. Dasey, who leaves Thursday to make his home in San Francisco, was called upon for a short address and expressed great regret at leaving Medford. "Medford has done many things for me," he stated. "Medford has meant Rotary and Rotary has meant a better understanding of my fellow men. I am sorry to leave and hope to come back. Associations here have been closer than anything in my life."

Best of the central civic council upon leaving Mr. Dasey was expressed by W. W. Allen.

# STRICT RULES FOR COUNTY IN WEEVIL BATTLE

After a thorough survey of Jackson county the area known positively to be infested with alfalfa weevil is roughly as follows: All that section of the valley between the mountains on the west side and the mountains on the east side south of Rogue River. In order to delay as long as possible the spread of the weevil to other districts where the weevil has not been found, within the county, hay will not be permitted to be moved from the above district to other parts of the county such as the section north of the Rogue River, Sams Valley, Applegate valley, Wellen, Little Butte, Bold Hill, Willow Springs or other points east, west or north of these districts.

The whole of Jackson county is included in the quarantine by the state and other states and no hay or straw can be taken into any other county. Any such shipments will be returned or destroyed.

Household goods to be moved out of the county must have no hay or straw used in packing and all such shipments must be accompanied by proper certificate.

erees appointed to pass upon the merits of the disbarment charges were announced several months ago, the referees suggesting that Joseph be permanently disbarred, and that Mannix be forbidden to practice within the next three years.

In the May 16 primary election Joseph, on a platform advocating "free press and free speech," received the Republican nomination for governor.

After holding that the Joseph charges against Justice Rand were malicious, unfounded and unproven and his accusations against Justice McBride were "scandalous matter" and that it was unprofessional for Joseph to make such charges "without first having made a careful investigation to ascertain the truth," the opinion takes up the question of penalty.

tude of the defendant," says the opinion, "and his insistence upon the right to do what has been done, this court would be inclined to extend leniency. Defendant has never expressed any regret for having thus gone far beyond the bounds of decent and legitimate criticism. It is impossible to measure the damage done by his charge of corruption, tending to destroy the confidence and respect of people for courts. Under the circumstances he cannot reasonably expect leniency, nor can we consistently grant it. We are not interested in any vindictive punishment. Our concern is in the good name of this court and in the preservation of its usefulness. We, therefore, adopt the recommendation of the referees that Joseph be disbarred. The facts and the law warrant it. This order of disbarment, however, does not preclude him from making application for reinstatement whenever he files a fair and true" the opinion takes up the question of penalty.

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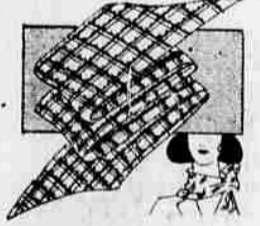

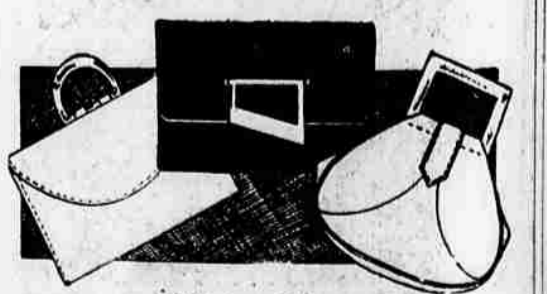
