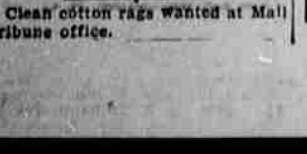

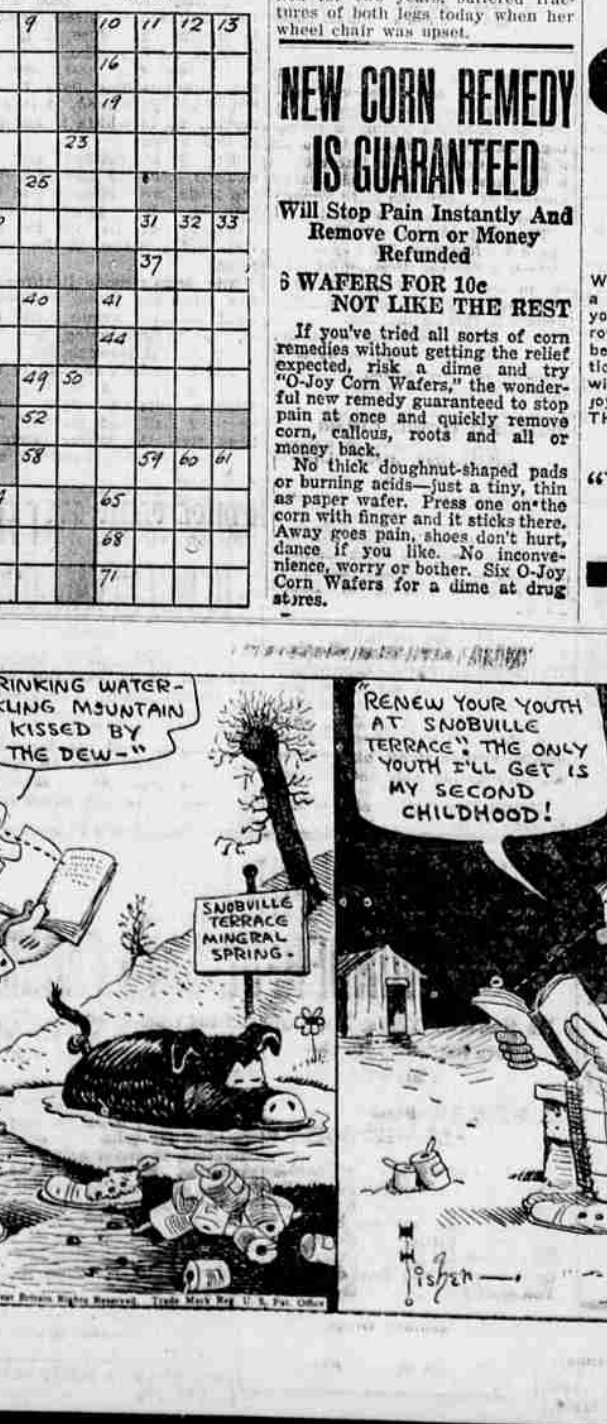

Oxalic Acid in Pie Plant. If there is sufficient oxalic acid in rhubarb to injure health, and if so, is there any way to eliminate it in cooking or preparing the rhubarb? How does oxalic acid affect the system? (O. M. L.)

Bad Tonsils Stolen While You Wake. An accomplice conceded there might be something in all I had said (and I had said considerable) about the diathermy extirpation of tonsils and the scandal of surgical tonsillectomy.

He first determines whether the patient's gagging reflex is very active, by inserting a tongue depressor and noting how the patient reacts to it. If the reflex is too active, he suppresses it with an application of cocaine. In about half the cases this is not necessary, but he infiltrates the deep pedicle or root of the tonsil with a solution of quinine and urea hydrochlorid skillfully placing this exactly between the two nerves entering the tonsil at that point.
