Wall Street Report

NEW YORK, June 9.—(AP)—Share prices suffered another sharp sinking spell in the last hour of trading in today's stock market, after working steadily lower from the opening ring. U. S. Steel sold off about \$2 to a new low for the year close to \$142, and losses of \$3 to \$19 were sprinkled over a range of important stocks, while a few volatile issues tumbled \$10 to nearly \$30. Amusement shares were dumped overboard in huge volume in the last hour, in what was variously attributed in brokerage circles to a bear drive, or to collapse of pool operations. Warner Bros. dropped more than \$3 a share to \$50.50 a share, compared to the year's high of a few weeks ago or \$80.25. Radio Keith dropped more than \$6 to \$30 a share, compared to the recent record level of \$50. Radio Corp and Paramount each lost \$3. The closing was weak. Sales approximated 4,000,000 shares, of which more than one-third were traded in the last hour. Today's closing prices for 15 selected stocks follow:
