BUTTER AND EGGS PRICE UNCHANGED ON WEAKER MART

PORTLAND, June 14.—(AP) Butter and egg values both appeared weak today but no price changes were announced. Receipts have been large and demand light in comparison. Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland Bureau of the U. S. Department of Agriculture says: "Old potatoes at Portland's four principal cold storage warehouses totalled 17,000 sacks, or about 47 cars, on May 12. "Movement of early varieties of green peas is now at its height, and quality is generally very good. Today's market is steady. "Carrots, beets and turnips are in only sufficient supply for Portland's requirements, with no exportable surplus. At 45c per dozen bunches. "The cantaloupe market has recovered from its recent over-supply and depression. Today's market is firm, and prices stronger."

GRAIN PRICES DIP TO LOWEST LEVEL

CHICAGO, June 14.—(AP)—All deliveries of wheat, corn, oats and rye broke to new bottom levels for the season today under pressure of selling induced chiefly by good weather conditions in the growing grain belts. July wheat sank below the dollar mark for the first time this year. July wheat struck bottom at 99 cents a bushel, the lowest price for wheat since February 25, when March contracts were traded at 98 3/4 cents. The net loss for the day in wheat was 1 1/2-2 1/2 cents a bushel. Closing prices were: July, 99 1/2-5/8; Sept., 1.01 1/2-5/8; and December, 1.06 1/2-5/8.
