The tall Gary Cooper is very likeable in the part of the much-hunted and taciturn "Liano Kid," a brave, hard-riding and quick-shooting young bandit in Texas, were the picture story opens, who finds further unexpected adventure, love, reform and a home in the Pampas of South America. There is plenty of shooting and fast action throughout.

The characterization by Fay Wray of a charming, home-loving Spanish senorita is also a good piece of acting.

Others conspicuous in the support cast are James Marcus, the religious and scripture-quoting sheriff; Oscar Apfel as the contemptible crook, who in his wicked plotting unexpectedly changes the whole course of the Liano Kid's life.

The humor of "The Texan" for the most part is of the natural kind that arises in the development of the story, in the dialogue and situations.
