FEWER EARWIGS LEFT TO FIGHT FOR LIFE HERE

Favorable results of the campaign waged against earwigs last year were seen when this season's battle opened this morning, according to reports from the county agent's office. The infested areas, where the pest was distributed last year, are inhibited by a greatly decreased colony of bugs. Elmer Outman, head of the campaign, stated after his first hour's journey.

There are three or four infested areas in Medford and earwigs are still to be found there but the number is much less where the poisoning campaign was carried out.

Mr. Outman and a small crew of men started on a survey of the city this morning. Wherever the earwigs are found the owners of the property will be asked to poison them and given full directions for eradicating the bugs. It is hoped that the people will co-operate with the officials in attempting to rid Medford of this pest before the earwigs multiply beyond control, as they have in other cities.
