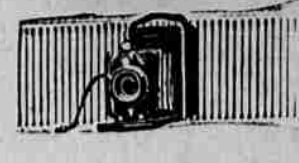

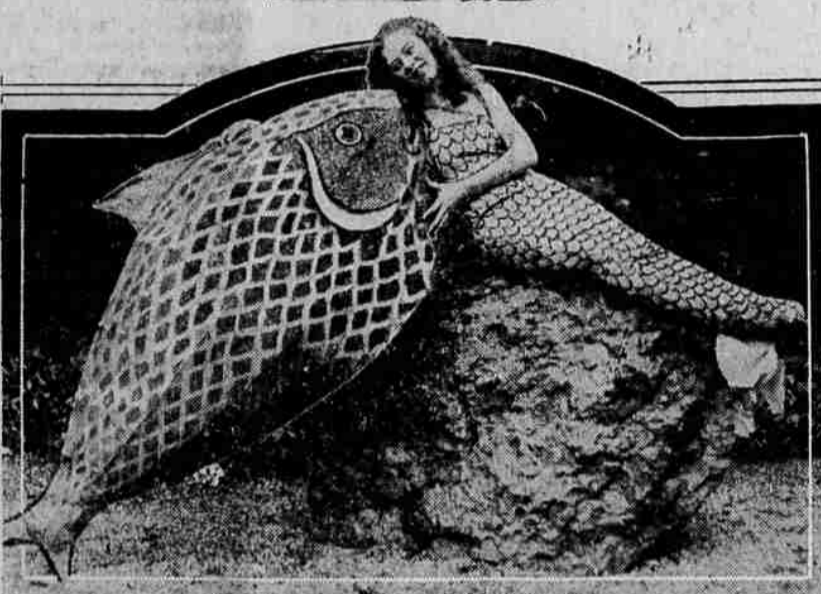

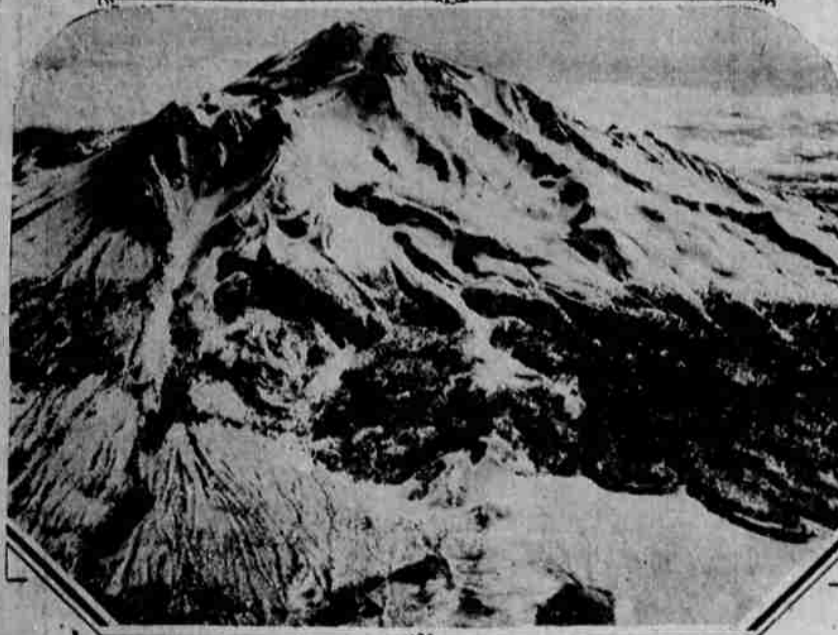

THE BEST IN ARCHITECTURE 2400 YEARS AGO AND TODAY is strikingly presented in these interesting photos. In sharp contrast to the severe simplicity and restraint of the beautiful Parthenon (below) in Athens, Greece, a structure which was once called "the most beautiful building in the world," observe in the Manhattan sky line above the fantastic effect produced by a jungle of serried towers, lavishly and carefully designed. Just as the Parthenon was regarded as the highest triumph of Greek Doric architecture, the Woolworth Building, shown towering above its neighboring skyscrapers in the above photo, is also considered the finest existing example of its type. It is often called, in fact, "the cathedral of commerce."
