## Spread Fame of Rogue on Shrine Junket

### LAUD CANADIAN HOSPITALITY TO VISITING SHRINE

Jerome, Alenderfer and Barnett Say North American Conclave Most Successful Yet.

"A marvelous time" That is the way E. C. "Jerry" Jerome and O. O. Alenderfer of Medford and Reginald Barnett of Grants Pass described their recent jaunt to Toronto where the Shrine of North America staged its annual imperial session. "Never have I seen an imperial session so successful and never have I experienced hospitality that exceeded that of the Canadians," said Jerry Jerome and his opinion was enthusiastically seconded by the other two special representatives of Hillah temple, southern Oregon's Shrine organization.

And by the Rogue River valley's representation at the Toronto session, southern Oregon gained some valuable advertising. Shrine members from the eastern and southern parts of the United States and from various sections of Canada were eager to hear of the southern Oregon country and little Hillah temple added to its already enviable place in Shrinedom through its capable representation at this year's conclave.

**Hillah Is Known**  
"No small Shrine temple in the United States is better known and has a finer standing in Shrine circles than Hillah," Past Potentate Jerome said today. "Through our active participation in former imperial sessions, the southern Oregon Shrine organization has made a real name for itself, and the Hillah patrol, through its showing at the Los Angeles gathering a year ago, has also helped a great deal in putting Hillah temple on the Shrine map."

O. O. Alenderfer, Oriental guide of Hillah temple, was especially impressed with the hospitality of the Canadians. "The cause of peace was given a great impetus through the imperial session activities at Toronto last month," Alenderfer said. "We were certainly made to feel that we were welcome in the Canadian metropolises and high officials of the dominion were active participants in all Shrine activities."

Following the imperial session the southern Oregon delegates visited in eastern cities before returning to Medford. Among the sporting events, Jerome and Alenderfer witnessed the fistie fray between W. L. "Young" Stribling and Otto Von Porat, in which the widely heralded Norwegian championship contender was stopped by the phenomenal American.

Stribling, in Jerry and Ole's opinions, is a real contender and shows genuine ring class. Proper handling will make an outstanding fighter out of "Young" Stribling in their opinions.

The Stribling-Von Porat battle was staged in the fine new Chicago auditorium which houses 21,000 fans under one roof.

## ALIEN REDS STAGE RIOT IN HARLEM

### Policeman Kills Member of Mob After Attack—Dead Negro Cause of Demonstration—More Trouble Brewing at Funeral.

NEW YORK, July 1.—(AP)—Undeterred by the slaying of one of their number by a policeman during a melee yesterday, Harlem communists were planning another demonstration today in honor of a dead negro whom they view as a martyr to their cause.

Thirty Mexican and Spanish communists were parading to the funeral parlor in Lenox avenue where lay the body of Alfred Luro when a riot developed over an attempt by Patrolman Edmund O'Brien to halt the procession because it lacked a parade permit.

The policeman was knocked down and beaten and his club wrested from him. Regaining his feet, he fired one shot at Gonzalo Gonzales, a Mexican communist, whom he said was the one who had taken his club and beaten him with it. The shot struck Gonzales in the heart and he died in a taxicab in which O'Brien was taking him to a hospital.

After the shooting the parading communists fled. O'Brien was treated at the hospital for severe bruises of the head, arms and legs.

The communists planned to have 4000 members attend the funeral procession of Luro late today. They contend he died of a fractured skull Saturday after he had been beaten by a policeman. The police maintain the negro was hit by a missile thrown from a roof.

After an autopsy it was announced death had been caused by apoplexy.
