CRATER STAGES OPEN SCHEDULE SERVICE TODAY

The Crater Lake season for 1930 opened today, although tourists and other visitors have been going up to the national park for weeks past by the hundreds, making the round trip in one day, and since the opening of the lodge last Friday for longer stays.

The opening today lacks the usual importance of that occasion for years past, the fine weather and snow disappearance from the roads and elsewhere stimulated the early pre-season travel, and caused the cafeteria to be opened over a week ago, and the lodge last Friday.

The features of today's opening were that the stages began operating between the lodge and Medford, Klamath Falls and Chiloquin, and the boating and other park concessions were in operation for the first time this season.

Crater Lake national park will enjoy an unusually large attendance over the Fourth of July, and already the big lodge is beginning to fill up, and as usual will do a capacity business over the Fourth.

The mail service between Medford and the lodge also began today.

The two stages operating between Medford and Crater Lake today started on their season's schedule this morning. The stages leave here for the lake following the arrival of the 10:40 and 12:40 a. m. trains, and return to Medford in the evening, meeting the 6:15 train. O. M. Murphy and Leslie Dunagan are the drivers.
