

# POLITICIANS BLAMED IN DRY FIASCO

### New York Administrator Resigns When Ordered to New Post — Says Party Seeking Bolster Power by Winking at Violations.

NEW YORK, July 1.—(AP) Major Maurice Campbell, until today prohibition administrator for New York, advocates the repeal of the Eighteenth Amendment.

He resigned when ordered to Boston to take charge of alcohol permits under the treasury department in the reorganization of the prohibition forces which transferred enforcement to the department of justice.

His declaration for repeal of the Eighteenth Amendment was part of a statement published today in which he charged that his transfer to Boston resulted from refusal to grant or restore brewery, whiskey and alcohol permits which "local politicians and certain administration officials in Washington feel must be restored to secure necessary support for the Republican ticket in New York this fall."

Referring to William B. Moss, who has been transferred from the post of prohibition administrator at Albany, N. Y., to take charge of alcohol permits in New York, Campbell said:

"Possibly officials in Washington think he can be more easily swayed than myself. I do not know, but I now publicly admonish him to gather together all his strength to withstand the onslaught for I am sure he will have need for all the ability and courage he can command."

"And now, after four years as one of the highest field officials in prohibition enforcement, with three years of that time as administrator in New York, I publicly declare that certain treasury officials who have been charged with enforcement of the national prohibition act, and who are still to remain in charge of kindred activities, have not been sincere in their efforts to enforce this law."

"Further, in New York and other areas in which the sentiment of the people is predominantly wet, this transfer of enforcement activities to the department of justice will mean nothing so long as prohibition prosecutions are left to United States attorneys who possess political aspirations, the success of which must depend upon their ability to win the approval of local politicians and their community for their prosecuting activities."

"Finally, after my years of service in the prohibition bureau, after watching closely the results of prohibition from the inside and after the most thoughtful and serious consideration of the matter I have reached the following conclusion: "Prohibition is not the logical solution for temperance in our form of government, and I now publicly advocate the repeal of the Eighteenth Amendment before the nation is consumed in the fires of its consequences."

WASHINGTON, July 1.—(AP)—Responsibility for prohibition enforcement passed today from Sec-

retary Mellon to Attorney General Mitchell. The transfer became a legal fact at midnight. The last treasury act on behalf of the dry laws as such was the issuance of "a factual outline of public aid and cooperation in promoting prohibition law observance and enforcement." This monograph, of the educational series put out under congressional direction, was in the mails to all sections of the country today. And in its wake was speculation whether the justice department would foster more of its like. Attorney General Mitchell's moves are being closely watched for indications of whether his course will differ radically from that pursued by Mr. Mellon. This interest was accentuated by the attack of Maurice Campbell, in resigning as prohibition administrator for New York, upon "local politicians and certain administration officials in Washington."

## EXPECT QUIET MEET OF COUNCIL TONIGHT
